

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

Remember that June is the month of the Most Holy Rosary of Our Lady!

AS I WRITE THIS...

...I am still on the east coast, freeloading on my relatives (and having a wonderful time). By the time you read this, however, I will have already returned and am back on the job. Being essentially vacant (which, I suppose, is why it's called a "vacation"), I don't have a lot to tell, but there are a couple of things, as you will see as you scroll down.

IT'S TIME FOR THE 150 TO ASSEMBLE!

I've written and spoken about the formation of the "St. Angela Merici 150 Club", whose main purpose is to gather our parishioners for an annual bash (taking the place of the demised Dinner/ Auction), while we try to make a couple of bucks on the side. When you are presented with the formal application form, please consider joining. It will make you eligible for lucrative monthly raffle drawings (which you may or may not win) and for the "annual bash" (which is a sure winner!) and the big prize raffle at the bash (which, again, you may or may not win). Your membership fee of \$150 (\$200 for a couple) qualifies you for the whole year. Come and take part!

BIG CHANGES FOR OUR SCHOOL

I suspect that you've heard a lot of rumors about the fate of our parish school. Frankly, rumors have been circulating for years and they're based on the perception that the number and percentage of Catholic kids in our Catholic school is (and has been for years) on the wane. This perception is quite accurate. Over the past decade, the number of baptisms at St. Angela has been in single digits (with half of them being adults!). Right now, there are two children in our First Communion class for next year. Obviously, this is a situation that will only get worse and it makes no sense for it to continue as it is. Some changes need to be made.

The Archdiocese has been conducting very extensive research into the situation. They started doing this long before I arrived here, but now they are doing it with an accelerated sense of urgency. We have been told that by the end of this month, changes in the format and structure of Catholic schools of the Northeast Deanery (that's ours) will be announced. The changes will embrace *all* the parishes. I cannot say what form those changes will take, not because I'm sworn to secrecy, but because I haven't been told and just don't know. All I can say for sure is that there will be changes and the purpose of these changes is to make our schools more viable and more Catholic.

I also can say this: there will *always* be a Catholic school for our kids to go to and we are obliged to help support those kids and their parents. Right now, literally every kid in our parish of school age (with the lone exception of our home-schooled kids) goes to our school. I would like to see those kids continue with their Catholic education and will do everything I can to make sure that it does.
