From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY!

THE ELECTION

By all means, vote. It's not my place to tell you how to vote. It is my duty, however, to point out to you that one of the major political parties running candidates for offices in this election is 100% committed to the promotion of what Pope St. John Paul II called the "Culture of Death" (i.e., abortion [and particularly its most heinous and barbaric form: partial birth abortion], euthanasia, "gay marriage", and the generous funding of the diabolical "Planned Parenthood") and the persecution of all who fight against it. Before you vote, just ask yourself whether or not you want to become an accomplice to those crimes.

November being the month of the Holy Souls in Purgatory, I remind you of our obligation in Christian charity to do the spiritual work of mercy of praying for them. A beautiful Catholic tradition is to make a family pilgrimage to the graves of those who have preceded us in death to decorate their graves and offer prayers on their behalf. Why not take a Sunday this month to do that?

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

Since this Wednesday (Nov. 9) is the feast of the anniversary of the dedication of the church of St. John Lateran in Rome, let's see how much you know about it; it is the mother church of all Christendom:

1. Who is "St. John Lateran"?
2. What is its special place and function in the papacy?
3. How long has the Church owned that property?
4. How did the Church acquire that property?
5. When was the church dedicated?
6. Have any ecumenical councils of the Church been held there? If so, how many?
7. Why did the popes move to Avignon from 1304-1379?
8. Why do the popes no longer live at the Lateran?
9. How many popes are buried in the Lateran Archbasilica?
10. What two great relics are housed in the baldachin above the main altar?

ANSWERS: 1. There is no such person; it is actually the church of Christ the Savior, dedicated to the two saints John; the Baptist and the Evangelist, built of the estate of the ancient Lateran family 2. It is actually the pope's cathedral (most people are surprised to learn that St. Peter's is not the cathedral of the patriarchal See of Rome) 3. Being the very first piece of real estate the Catholic Church has ever owned, it our oldest land possession, dating from c. 320AD 4. The Laterans were proscribed by the Emperor Nero, who confiscated heir property (after he killed them). Eventually, the Lateran Estate fell into the hands of the Emperor Constantine's wife, and then Constantine donated the land to Pope St. Sylvester I for the specific purpose of building both the basilica and his own residence, the "Lateran Palace" 5. Nov. 9, 324AD 6. There have been five "Lateran Councils"; in 1123, 1189, 1179, 1215, and 1512-1517 (Vatican I and Vatican II would have been held there, except that it wasn't big enough) 7. Because in 1304 a Frenchman was elected pope and he found the ancient Lateran Palace to be a dump like the rest of Rome (which, at the time, they were), and so he moved to Avignon, which, though now situated in France, was part of the Papal States at the time. All the other popes after him also preferred Avignon to Rome, until St. Catherine of Sienna got the pope to return to Rome 8. Because when the pope returned to Rome in 1379, the Lateran Palace was an even bigger dump than it was 75 years earlier, so he built a new place for himself at the Vatican, where the popes have resided ever since 9. 18 are known (some others may be buried there, but it is unsure), the last being Pope Leo XIII (1903) 10. the skulls of Ss. Peter and Paul (which were reportedly removed and desecrated by the Protestants in the great sacking of Rome in 1527, but were eventually restored)




