From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT DECEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION!

MERRY CHRISTMAS TO ALL!

A special welcome and best Christmas blessings to you all! I give particular blessings to the children and grandchildren of our parishioners and to all our guests and visitors! We are honored that you chose to come and be with us today!

BEHOLD! I BEAR GLAD TIDINGS OF GREAT JOY!

And so, using these words, the angels announced to the shepherds in the fields of Bethlehem that the greatest event in human history, i.e., the Incarnation, God becoming man, had just taken place. This, of course, is what we celebrate today. But, in our case, there's more good news, namely, St. Angela Merici School will be open again next year!

I had met with our parishioners who have kids in our school a couple of months ago and told them that there would certainly be some changes for next year, and I couldn't rule out the closing of the school as one such possible outcome. I did promise them, however, that there would be a school for their children and that we would be able to do all that we are required to do to help them. As it turns out, there will be no change at all as to where their kids will be able to attend school next year; it will be here on the St. Angela Campus.

There will, however, be changes, but they will affect these families only indirectly. The Archdiocese is amalgamating the schools of our deanery under a "corporate" model, which means that each parish will have less autonomy over the running of the school. They have proposed that there be a united, sort-of umbrella name for this unified institution, calling "North County Catholic Academy" perhaps, and all our children will be students of *it*, attending at the "St. Angela Merici Campus". The Archdiocese also promised me that it would defray some of the costs of our school next year.

The bottom line: 1) St. Angela School will re-open for its 52nd year next fall, 2) it will still be *our* school, mostly, 3) the Archdiocese will run much of the day-to-day academic programs of the school, including personnel matters, and 4) the Archdiocese promised to help pay. Good news, indeed!

ANSWERS: 1. Traditionally, we accept the year 1 A.D. for Christ's Birth, but this is certainly not true; we really don't know for sure, but the best guess would place it somewhere from 7-4 B.C. 2. Dionysius Exiguus (Latin for "Little Denny") 3. Bethlehem (of course!) 4. Very briefly in Bethlehem, briefly in Egypt, but mostly in Nazareth (thus fulfilling the prophecy: "He shall be called a Nazorean") 5. The Gospels refer to Elizabeth as Mary's syngenis (in Greek); sometimes this is translated "cousin", other times "kinswoman" in English; actually, it could refer to any relationship from 1st to 4th cousin (and probably beyond), so "kinswoman" is probably the safest rendering; if the two mothers were "kinswomen" to one another, their sons would also be related to each other, but a bit more distantly than their mothers 6. Not certain at all (although there exists a one-in-365.25 chance that He was); the date was chosen because it coincides with the old pagan feast of the Natalis Sol Invictus ("Birth of the Unconquered Sun"), occurring, as it does, right next to the Winter Solstice; the Catholic Church couldn't suppress the feast (and all its attending rowdyism), so they baptized it and made it celebration of Jesus' Birth 7. Herod (known as "The Great") 8. Aaron (which meant she belonged to the priestly tribe of Levi) 9. A trough or some kind of open box which holds feed for livestock 10. "House of Bread" (could it be mere coincidence that He who would give us the True Heavenly Bread was born in the "House of Bread" and laid in a feedbox?)
