From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT DECEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION!

THE MOST WONDERFUL TIME OF THE YEAR...

...as the old Christmas tune says, would be now. I love the Advent season, which leads so beautifully into the season of the Nativity of the Messiah. As I keep pointing out, Advent is a discrete season from Christmas and has its own compelling and endearing customs. A big part of those is the traditions that surround the saints of the Advent season. This week (on Tuesday, Dec. 6, actually) we have the feast of St. Nicholas, one of the best known and most beloved of all God's hallows. He was a 4th c. Greek bishop whose love of children and solicitude for the poor have made him the very personification of the bounty of God's goodness and Christian generosity. He became, of course, the model for the figure of Santa Claus, whose very name is but a corruption of "St. Nicholas". You know the custom: the children hang up their socks (or put out their shoes, depending) and in the night, the saintly bishop comes and fills them with treats, but *only if the children have been good!* If they have not been good, the mischievous Rupprecht comes and gives them coals (which, I suppose, is no longer a concern since President Obama destroyed the coal industry!). And don't forget the Advent Vespers. We had a great turnout last Sunday despite the rain, and will keep on celebrating them for all of Advent's four Sundays. All are welcome!

MARY IMMACULATE, PATRONESS OF OUR NATION

Another great feast that falls in the course of the Advent season is that of the Immaculate Conception, who was chosen by the bishops of America (our Bishop Kenrick being one of them) in 1846 to be the protectress and patroness of the United States. It's a huge feast and is, naturally, a holy day of obligation. Consequently, we will have four Masses for the feast: this Wednesday, Dec. 7, at 6:00PM, and this Thursday, Dec. 8, at 6:30 & 8:00AM and again at 7:00PM (notice that there's a time difference for the two evening Masses). Come and celebrate this great feast!




