### LORETTO ALUMNI

It is my fondest hope that all of our new parishioners who are veterans from the old O. L. of Loretto/the Rosary feel at home here and get involved in the social and spiritual life of our parish. Toward that end, if you are new to our parish, I extend a special invitation to you to join one of our parish organizations and join in the society and service of this great parish. The various parish organizations are listed on pages 6-12 of our "Parish Directory and Guidebook" (free copies of which are available from the parish office). It gives descriptions of what each organization does, when they meet, and who's in charge of them. I want to give a particular emphasis to our Men's Club, which meets in the lunchroom on the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of each month (so their next meeting is tomorrow, Aug. 22) and the Ladies' Club, which meets on the first Wednesday of each month. Because we're "old school" here, you have to be an actual male to join the Men's Club and a true female to join the Ladies' Club, and you have to be an authentic senior citizen (55 & older) to join our "SAMS", i.e., the St. Angela Merici Seniors, who are a real fun group who meet in the gym for lunch on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of each month. 10. How big was the city of St. Louis as it was originally laid out?

*ANSWERS: 1. 1764 2. August Chouteau, working for Pierre Laclede 3. 14 years old 4. It was located on the west side of the Mississippi so as to be in French territory, it was close to the confluence of the Missouri and the Mississippi, and it was downstream from the confluence, and on high ground (so it wouldn't be flooded) 5. To be an outpost for the fur trappers of the region 6. The logs were set vertically (in the French style), rather than in the English style, horizontally (like "Lincoln Logs") 7. The Archdiocese of Quebec, then Santiago (Cuba), Louisiana and the Two Floridas, the Diocese of St. Louis, and the Archdiocese of St. Louis 8. The land underneath the Old Cathedral and Lafayette Park (the Cathedral land was given to the Church by Laclede and the Park was part of the old "St. Louis Commons", which belonged to everybody collectively and it still does) 9. Ste. Genevieve (he thought the people of St. Louis were too immoral) 10. It was pretty much the area that now comprises the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial and Laclede's Landing*

This applies to innocent babies, too.



Their lives depend on the choices we make,


