From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT AUGUST IS THE MONTH OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT!

AD ORIENTEM (part 4)

Throughout most of her 2,000 years, the Church has experienced change gradually and almost imperceptibly. Changes in worship, custom, and Catholic culture constantly took place, but it all occurred so slowly, so naturally, and so agreeably that people hardly noticed the difference. It all happened in exactly the same way as an oak tree grows; you plant it and let it go and then, 60 years later, you've got this enormous tree towering over everything and providing copious shade. For that reason, the word that is typically used in the Church to describe that kind of change is "organic". (Which is also why one often hears the proverb that "the Church moves at the speed of a glacier".)

Organic change is always the best. It never causes the kind of upheaval that sends aristocrats to the guillotine and leaves blood on the streets. That is a very good thing. On top of that, everybody accepts it because it just seems right. In that, it's comparable to an infant's growth and maturation into adulthood; everybody expects it, desires it, prepares for it, and considers it a good thing. If you attended Mass in 1962 (the year the Vatican Council began), you would know that, essentially, that Mass was the same spiritual reality as the Last Supper (in 33 A.D.), but you would also know that the prayers and rituals you were performing were a lot different from the first Mass. The Church had experienced a great deal of "organic" change in her liturgy in the intervening 1,929 years. Because of that, there was (and still is) a great diversity of rites that are all under the umbrella of authentic Catholic worship (we have two of them here in St. Louis, namely, the Maronite and Ruthenian).

The change that took place at the Council and in its aftermath, however, did leave blood on the streets (well, metaphorically speaking). The reason why is two-fold; first, because it was not "organic", and, second, because it was massive. It was like trying to cram an entire six course meal down somebody's throat in ten seconds. The changes included things like use of vernacular language, the *ad populum* posture, the abandonment of Gregorian Chant, the use of other musical instruments than the pipe organ, female altar servers, lay Eucharistic ministers, and, on top of all that, the total re-structuring of the prayers and rites of the Mass. There's plenty there to leave the streets bloody. (Do you know how many of those things were actually mandated by the Council? Answer: zero.)

Many Catholics my age and older have the sense that they were jerked around. The reason why is because we were. I'm using a lot of words to say this, but my point is very simple: we've been jerked around enough, so when it comes to employing the *ad orientem* posture at Mass, I'm not going to ram anything down anybody's throat. I do believe, however, that we are obligated to implement the true reforms of the Vatican Council, but I'd like to see that happen "organically".

THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY

This great feast is celebrated on August 15th each year and is a holy day of obligation. Usually. This year, however, it lands on a Monday, and so the bishops say that we don't *have* to go to Mass that day. We do, on the other hand, *get* to go to Mass that day. To make it easier for those who wish to attend Mass, I will offer two Masses that day, at 6:30 and 8:00AM.

JOIN THE 150

I mentioned the start of the "150 Club" last week and, as you read this, we just had the first formational meeting last Thursday. I, however, am writing this on last Wednesday, so I don't know how it all panned out. I will let you know when I know, so stay tuned...




