From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT AUGUST IS THE MONTH OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT AND SEPTEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE SEVEN DOLORS OF MARY!

OUR OLIVE WOOD CRUCIFIX...

...is, even now, as I write, being prepped for its ultimate installation in our parish church. It will be mounted on a wood background that will match the woodwork in the sanctuary and be placed in the corner above the interior exit doors (the ones that open up into the vestibule) so that the two crucifixes of church will face each other, and you will see Our Savior on His Cross as you enter *and* as you leave. I hope to have it up by the end of this month.

CATECHISM CLASS

My discussion group on the catechism of the Catholic Church will resume this month on Tuesday evening, Sep. 20 (after devotions, in the parish meeting room). I call it “Catechism Class”, but in reality, it’s a discussion group about every aspect of the faith; the Catechism is the focal point. We discuss whatever topics come up and when the discussion breaks down, we go back to the Catechism and stir things up again. It’s as informal as it is informational and absolutely everyone is welcome. That means that it’s not necessary that you’ve sat in with us before. Some come and find out what’s going on in our great Catholic Church!

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

This weekend marks the beginning of the month of September, dedicated in our Catholic piety to the “dolors” (or, “sorrows”) of the Blessed Mother. It will be your task to answer these questions based on this long-standing Catholic devotion:

1. What given name for girls is derived from the sorrows of Our Lady?
2. The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows occurs this month; on what date?
3. There is a special sequence for the feast of Our Lady’s Dolors, but is now mostly used as a hymn with the Stations of the Cross; what is it?
4. Why was the feast’s date chosen?
5. What religious order is associated with the origins of this devotion?
6. In what century and for what specific purpose was this devotion given a feast day?
7. Name the Seven Dolors of the B.V.M.

ANSWERS: 1. Dolores 2. September 15 3. The Stabat Mater (“At the Cross, her station keeping...”) 4. To connect it with the feast of the day before (9/14), the Feast of the Holy Cross, and it’s the last day of the Octave of her Nativity (9/8) 5. The Servites (13th c.) 6. In the 15th c., to expiate the sins of the followers of the notorious heretic, John Hus 7. The Prophecy of Simeon (that a sword would pierce her heart), the Flight into Egypt, Losing Jesus in the Temple when He was 12, Meeting Jesus on the way to Calvary (the 4th station), Standing at the Foot of the Cross, the Removal from the Cross, the Burial of Christ






