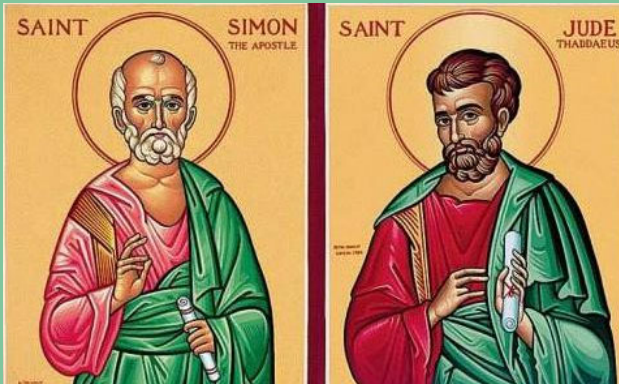

Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel, Piety, Fortitude (or Courage), and Fear of the Lord 8. Feed the hungry, clothe the naked, drench** the thirsty, shelter the homeless, tend to the sick, visit the imprisoned, bury the dead 9.
