From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT AUGUST IS THE MONTH OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT!

UPDATES: Here's updating you on a variety of things that have recently appeared in this space:

- **THE 150 CLUB** Will be starting soon. The concept is simple: you join the club by paying your dues (most likely, they will be \$150 for one person and \$200 for a couple), and, having done so, these benefits will accrue to you: 1) eligibility for a lucrative raffle each month, 2) free attendance at the swank Dinner/Dance at the end of the year, 3) eligibility for the *really* lucrative raffle at the Dinner/Dance, and 4) the deep-down satisfaction of knowing that you've done good and did it well!

- **LOURDES/FATIMA/ROME/ASSISI TRIP** I've met with the travel agent (Jeff Stoll) and, yes, the dates I gave you last week are firm. I have made copies of the proposed itinerary available in the vestibule of church (anybody who is the least bit interested can take one). Right now, Jeff is lining up hotels, plane fares, busses, etc. so as to come up with a price for the whole package. When I have that info, I will pass it along *quam primum* (as we used to say in Latin class), i.e., "right away"!

- **BEYOND SUNDAY** The first phase of this program, in which certain members of our parish are targeted for a contribution, is still going on. If you have not been contacted already, that means you are not part of the first phase. When the first phase is completed, the rest of you will be contacted, most likely through the mail (probably in October). The purpose of this program is to help middle-class Catholic families afford the tuition for their kids at Catholic school. Please pray for the success of the program and, when called, be as generous as you can.

CATECHISM CLASS

As you know, I've been meeting bi-weekly (or semi-monthly, if you will) with whoever wishes to attend in order to study the Catechism of the Catholic Church. I purposely chose to do *this* rather than a Bible-study precisely because we are *Catholics*. It's perhaps the biggest heresy of all Protestantism that the Bible is the source of our faith. Not true, never has been true. The "Bible" didn't exist until four centuries after Christ! How could it possibly have been the sole, or even the main, instrument through which Jesus instructed His people? Jesus didn't write any part of the Bible, didn't dictate any part of it, nor command any of it to be written. The Bible never claims to be the main source of the faith and even acknowledges its own limitations (John 21:30). What He did do was give us the *Church*, His Mystical Body, who would first preserve His words, and then disseminate them as Jesus did, like the sower sowing the Good Seed. Since the Gospels do not record *every* spoken word of Jesus, does that mean that those words are lost forever? Of course not. Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit on the Church to *remind* her of everything He taught. The fullness of what Jesus taught is not to be found in the Bible, but in the Sacred Tradition of the Church, which includes the Bible, and is recorded in the Church's Catechism, which brings both Scripture and Tradition together.

As a consequence, my Catechism Class convenes on the first and third Tuesdays of each month. We took the summer off but will start up again on Tuesday, Sept. 20. We meet after Devotions & Benediction in the parish meeting room (located next to my office). All are most sincerely welcome!
