FOOD FOR THE POOR

This weekend, Fr. Robert White of Venice, Florida will celebrate all the Masses at our parish. He comes to us on behalf of the organization he represents, namely, Food For The Poor. (I will be out of town in Omaha attending a Catholic convention.) I ask you to welcome Fr. White and to be generous in response to his appeal. Envelopes for your contribution will be found in the pews. You may either drop them in the basket this weekend or wait until next week. We'll be sure that it winds up in the right place. (I'll be back Monday evening.)

FLOOD RELIEF

As I mentioned in church last week, Archbishop Carlson has asked all the parishes of our archdiocese to take up a special collection to come to the immediate aid of our fellow countrymen down south who are the victims of record flooding. There will not be a *second* passing of the basket, so I ask that all your contributions be made at one time. So please do one of the following:

A) put your contribution in a separate envelope (with your name on it) marked "FLOOD RELIEF" and drop it in the basket, or B) write a separate check (made out to St. Angela's) and mark it "FLOOD RELIEF" (on the line in the lower left corner) and include it with your usual Sunday envelope, or C) mail or drop off your contribution at the parish office. In all cases, make your checks payable to St. Angela Merici. You will do great good. (This collection will be taken up next weekend.)

CATECHISM CLASS

The fall term of my catechism class commences this Tuesday, Sept. 20. No tuition, no fees, no academic credit, but those who graduate (by the summer of 2029) will have their doctorate in sound Catholic teaching and will provide much sterner resistance to Satan and his wiles. All, of course, are welcome to attend, previous experience not required. We will meet in the Parish Meeting Room (located next to my office) right after the Tuesday evening devotions (so about 7:20PM).

BEYOND SUNDAY

The signs have been up for a while and the campaign has been going on in other places for over a year, so when, a lot of people are asking, are *we* going to take part in Beyond Sunday? We've all been part of capital campaigns and, therefore, know that they all follow a specific, well-defined procedure. We're still in the beginning phase of the program, which will go on for another couple of weeks (at least). After that, there will be a general solicitation of the parish (which will follow much the same process as the A.C.A.). So don't wander off...it's on the way!

GROTTO

As you enter the sylvan glade that is our parish campus, made a florid bower through the loving ministrations of our Garden Sodality, just to the right you will find our parish Lady Grotto with its plaza of memorial paving stones. Constructed (so I've been told) by our parishioner alumni of St. Christopher's at the time of the merging and tenderly maintained by them, it had fallen into disrepair. This is no longer the case! Bill Keeven and his trusty crew have leveled out the pavers and painted everything so that it is once again the inestimable parish asset it was always meant to be. Our thanks to these wonderful guys for the care they lavish on our parish grounds. (Spoiler alert: one of our young parishioners, Peter Hedlesky, has taken on the grotto as his Eagle Scout project, so look for a further enhancement of it in the future!)
