## From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

**REMEMBER THAT SEPTEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE SEVEN DOLORS OF MARY  
AND OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY!**

### THE HOLY ROSARY

This Saturday, the month of October begins. In our Catholic piety, it is the month dedicated to the praying of the rosary. This is because Friday, October 7, is the feast of the Most Holy Rosary, a festival established by no less a champion than Pope St. Pius V, the Hero of Lepanto. You'll recall that the Moslems had organized a huge armada to attack and conquer Italy and then fan out from there to consume and enslave all the rest of Europe. Despite the mortal peril, the Christian forces, ravaged into discord by the Protestant heresies, paid little heed to the threat. Only Pope Pius was keen to recognize just how dangerous the situation was. He tried to form his own armada, and did receive a certain measure of support from some of the seafaring Christian nations, but on the eve of battle his navy was seriously outshipped, out-manned, and out-gunned. He appointed Don John of Austria leader of the Christian forces, a move that, as it turned out, was to pay enormous dividends.

On October 7, 1571, the Moslem forces drew near Lepanto, and everything seemed to be in their favor. Not only did they outnumber the Christians 2-to-1 (both in ships and in men), but even the winds blew favorably in their direction. In Rome, Pope Pius solemnly led his court in the praying of the rosary. He was a Dominican, and Our Lady had given St. Dominic the rosary in the 13<sup>th</sup> century, so he knew its power. At that moment, the winds changed 180 degrees and 100 percent in favor of the Christians, and with them, so did the tide of the battle. In the end, it was a glorious rout: Christian Europe had been saved, Lepanto would enter history as a magnificent moment for the faith and be memorialized evermore in literature (you should read Chesterton's epic poem, *Lepanto*), and the Church received a new feast: Our Lady of the Rosary.

It's hard not to notice the parallels between the threats and dangers of then and now. The remedy will be the same, namely, the praying of the Most Holy Rosary.

### PRO-LIFE MARCH ON WASHINGTON, 2017

The leadership of our parish's annual bus trip to the Nation's Capital to protest the crime of abortion has changed, and the very existence of this wonderful, annual pilgrimage is up in the air. I want everyone who would like to go, to be able to go.
