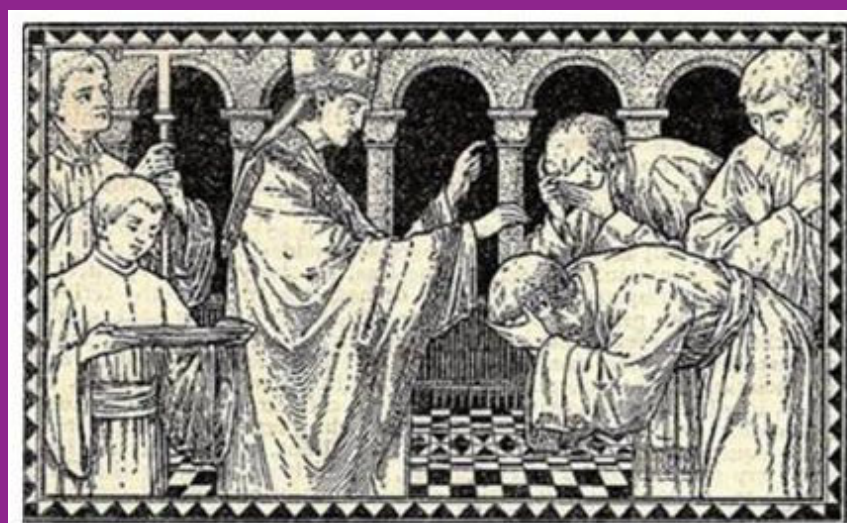

## *From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:*

***REMEMBER THAT FEBRUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY FAMILY AND  
MARCH IS THE MONTH OF SAINT JOSEPH!***

### **ASH WEDNESDAY: LENT BEGINS**

The forty days of Lent parallel the forty days that Jesus spent in the desert. He went into the desert immediately after His Baptism to prepare Himself, by prayer and fasting, for His Public Life, during which He would preach the Gospel, teach the truths of His Kingdom, suffer and die in reparation of our sins, and then be raised in glory as our pledge of life eternal. In the Church's earliest days, her catechumens would spend Lent's forty days also in prayer and fasting, but in preparation for the Church's great sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist), which they would receive on Holy Saturday night. Even though we have already received those sacraments, it's still our place to keep a good Lent; not in preparation to be baptized, but rather to make our baptismal promises new, in their great renewal on Easter Sunday.

The climax of Lent, therefore, is that moment on Easter Sunday when I ask you once again whether or not you reject Satan and all his works and pomps and believe in God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is to do precisely that that you fasted and prayed all through Lent's forty days.

We always have a full schedule of Lenten spiritual exercises here at St. Angela's and this year is no different. On Ash Wednesday itself we will have three Masses: 6:30 & 8:00AM and 7:00PM. We will walk the Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00PM, followed by our Lenten speaker series (the line-up of which is found elsewhere in this tome). Additionally, there will be extra times for the hearing of Confessions and we will have an 8:00AM Mass every Saturday during Lent (not just on first Saturday). And don't forget about daily Mass (8:00AM) or the Morning Prayer that precedes it, Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday (all day), and my Catechism Class, which convenes on the first and third Tuesdays of each month after the 7:00PM devotions in the parish meeting room.

Why does the Church impose this penitential season upon us? Because we *need* it (I know I sure do!); anybody who doesn't think so is only fooling himself. Remember: it's not the Pharisee boasting about his self-righteousness who is justified, but rather the tax collector who humbly begs God for the grace of His Mercy.

### **QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC**

As the caption at the head of this article declares, March is the month of St. Joseph. Let's see how much you know about him whom Scripture calls "upright" and "just":

2. We do not call Joseph Jesus' "father"; what title do we give him?

6. There's another biblical Joseph in Genesis; how does St. Joseph match up with him?
7. Since Joseph is clearly not Jesus' father, how is God's promise of the Messiah's coming through the offspring of David fulfilled?
8. Why did Bd. Pius IX proclaim St. Joseph "Protector of the Universal Church"?
9. Why is he the patron of a "happy death"?
10. What is his most famous line in Scripture?

***ANSWERS: 1. Tribe of Judah, descended from King David 2. Jesus' "Foster Father" 3. The Gospels say that he was a "tekton", which is usually translated "carpenter", although it could also mean any kind of construction worker 4. Because of the legend in which he and other suitors of the Blessed Mother were asked to put their staves in the temple overnight for a sign from the Lord as to whom He favored to become Mary's spouse; Joseph's staff blossomed while the others remained barren 5. Apparently, he was living in Nazareth at the time of the Incarnation, but his family came, after David, from Bethlehem***

6. Two big ways: dreams and Egypt. The Genesis Joseph gains fame for his singular gift of interpreting dreams and saves the Jewish nation by bringing it to Egypt, while St. Joseph receives messages from the angel in dreams and saves the Holy Family by leading it into Egypt 7. By giving Mary's Child the name he was told to give Him by the angel, Joseph claimed paternity of Jesus and so everything that Joseph has is now inherited by Jesus, including, according to the law, his lineage to David 8. Since Joseph protected and cared for Jesus' physical body on earth, it seemed a natural that he should also be the heavenly protector of His Mystical Body, the Church 9. Because it is presumed that he passed away in the presence of the Incarnation and the Immaculate Conception, which would be, as Shakespeare put it, "a consummation devoutly to be wished" 10. St. Joseph in Scripture is completely silent; he is never directly quoted

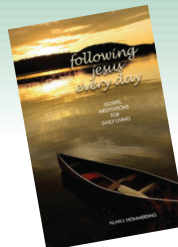
