## *From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:*

***REMEMBER THAT MARCH IS THE MONTH OF SAINT JOSEPH!***

### **LENTEN OBSERVANCES**

The last thing you want to do is to squander the tremendous opportunities for spiritual renewal and growth in this holy season. To help in the process, your parish is offering the following spiritual exercises and devotions in these sanctified forty days:

- A) Stations of the Cross, every Friday at 7:00PM, followed by...
- B) ...our Lenten Speaker Series
- C) Confessions every Tuesday from 1:00-1:30PM (in addition to 4:00PM Saturday)
- D) Daily Mass, including Saturday morning at 8:00AM
- E) Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday (all year long, but especially in Lent)

I would also ask to consider joining us for Morning Prayer. It's recited every weekday at 7:40AM and on Sunday at 9:00AM. It takes a bit of training to learn it, but we're willing to teach. Let me know if you'd like to join us and we'll get you all set up!

### **DECORATIONS FOR HOLY WEEK/EASTER**

As I mentioned last week, one of the new things we have planned as part of our extensive Holy Week/Easter decorations, is a tomb that will be set up at the St. Joseph shrine for Good Friday and Easter Week. We will follow the old (mostly German) custom of having a statue of Our Lord in death (for Good Friday) followed by the empty tomb. We are in the process of acquiring the statue at a cost of \$800 and are soliciting contributions from any who would be willing to donate. Please place your donation in an envelope marked "Good Friday Statue", include a list of anyone in whose memory the gift is being made and a check payable to our parish, and drop it in the collection basket or send it to the parish offices.

### **RCIA: THE SCRUTINIES**

Today being the third Sunday of Lent we will celebrate the first of the three scrutinies for our catechumens (the next two, of course, will be on the next two Sundays). They correspond with the very lengthy Gospel lessons from John, with each one pertaining somehow to Baptism. In former times, the new members would be quizzed (which is why they're called "scrutinies"), and then prayed for; now they're just prayed for. Please remember the new ones in your prayers!

### **ST. JOSEPH'S DAY**

In a normal year, we would be celebrating the great feast of the great St. Joseph today (which is why this month is dedicated to him in our Catholic piety), but, since it's the Third Sunday of Lent, St. Joseph is kicked to tomorrow. There will be special devotions to the Foster Father of Our Lord after the 8:00AM Mass, as we honor this distinguished hero whom Scriptures calls a "just and upright man".

### **QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC**

If I can beg your kind indulgence, we'll have this one on indulgences. See how much you know:

1. What is an indulgence?
2. What is "temporal punishment"?
3. Where does one pay his debt of temporal punishment?
4. How does one pay the debt of temporal punishment?
5. What does it mean to "offer up" human suffering?
6. What are the different kinds of indulgences?
7. What are the differences between the different kinds of indulgences?





## Features:

### CONTINUED

8. When the “300 days indulgence” is attached to a prayer, what does that mean?
9. Where does the pope get the authority to grant indulgences?
10. What are the conditions under which one can achieve an indulgence?

*ANSWERS: 1. The remission of the temporal punishment that is due to sins already forgiven 2. Sin causes damage, and this damage is not repaired merely by being forgiven; some work must be done and that usually requires suffering, and so temporal punishment typically involves suffering 3. Either here on earth or in purgatory 4. Through works of self-denial (i.e., fasting, abstinence, etc.), works of charity (i.e., the Works of Mercy, almsgiving, etc.), and the patient acceptance of our daily crosses 5. To apply the benefits of one’s earthly sufferings in reparation of one’s own sins, or those of another, whether on earth or in purgatory 6. There are two: plenary and partial 7. A plenary indulgence completely heals the damage done to the soul through sin so that no more temporal punishment is needed, and a partial indulgence administers only a partial healing 8. It does NOT mean that you only get 300 days off your time in purgatory; it does mean that the Church fortifies that prayer with such power that saying it would generate merit equal to doing 300 days of fasting, abstinence or almsgiving (because this was often misunderstood, the Church no longer attaches days to indulgences; it’s simply “partial”) 9. The granting of indulgences is considered to be part of the “power of the keys”. Jesus gave St. Peter (and all popes after him) the “keys to the Kingdom of Heaven”, with the power to “bind and loosen”. The popes have used their discretion to grant indulgences in order to exhort the faithful to perform holy works or support holy causes. It’s sort of like a “matching funds” scenario, in which a Catholic does X, and the Church matches that from the vast storehouse of grace given her by Christ so that it has the effect of 2X 10. a) One must be in a state of grace, b) have at least the general intention of gaining the indulgence, and c) perform the works required. (To gain a plenary indulgence, one must be free from all sin and from the intention to commit sin or stay in a sinful state.)*

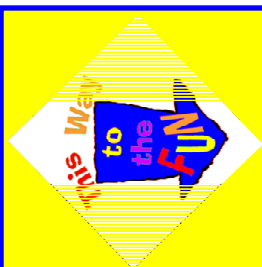

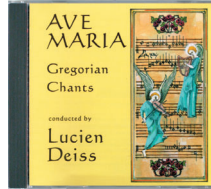

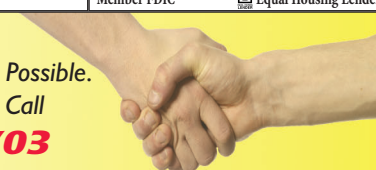
