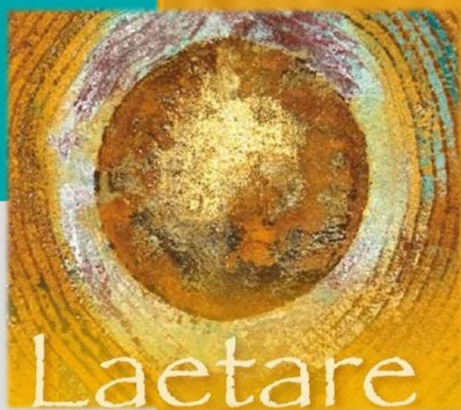

REMEMBER THAT MARCH IS THE MONTH OF SAINT JOSEPH AND APRIL IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SPIRIT!

LAETARE, HIEROSOLYME!

“Rejoice, O Jerusalem!” proclaims the entrance antiphon for today's Mass, setting the tone of modified merry-making on this *Laetare Sunday*, the rose-colored Sunday of Lent. This strongly penitential season is more than half-over, so it's time for a break from the purple, to loosen up a bit and rejoice. The long Gospel story of the “Man Born Blind” instructs us on the nature of our Baptism, whose vows we are preparing to renew on Easter Sunday. So take full advantage of the richness of our liturgical traditions and rejoice with Jerusalem today!

LENTEN OBSERVANCES

I want to remind you just once more of the Lenten devotions we offer:

- A) Stations of the Cross, every Friday at 7:00PM, followed by...
- B) ...our Lenten Speaker Series
- C) Confessions every Tuesday from 1:00-1:30PM (in addition to 4:00PM Saturday); next week, with the beginning of Passiontide, we'll have more times scheduled
- D) Daily Mass, including Saturday morning at 8:00AM
- E) Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday (all year long, but especially in Lent)

DECORATIONS FOR HOLY WEEK/EASTER

I also want to mention just one more time the beautiful Jesus in Death statue we will use for the first time this Good Friday, and ask again your support. It will cost \$800. If you would like to make a donation, put your offering in a separate envelope marked “Jesus in Death Statue” and drop it in the collection basket along with the names of those in whose memory your gift is given.

We just got through with St. Patrick's Day and its customary repast of pickled brisket and grown-up Brussels sprouts, so now it's time to look ahead and give the largest ethnic group in the United States, the Germans, their due. As the Irish claim St. Patrick, the Germans claim St. Boniface as their evangelizing missionary, and his feast day is June 5, which falls on a Monday this year. Our official unofficial catering chef, Don Krause (who used to operate a German restaurant here in Florissant), has offered to cook us a dinner of real German fare on that day to honor in appropriate style the Apostle to the Teutons. 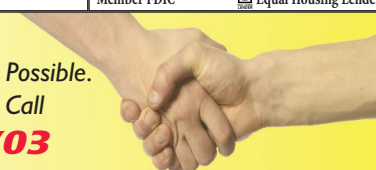
