From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT APRIL IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SPIRIT!

PASSIONTIDE

The last two weeks of Lent have long been known as “Passiontide”, and that’s because the whole focus of the season changes, putting the spotlight on the actual sufferings of Christ. In the traditional reckoning, the Fifth Sunday of Lent was known as “Passion Sunday”, with the sixth being called “Palm Sunday”. (Now today is called just the “Fifth Sunday of Lent” and Palm Sunday is called “Passion Sunday [Palm Sunday]”.) This is the time when we get real serious about the state of our souls and look to change those things that need changing.

To help set the mood for Passiontide, our church decorator *par excellence*, Don Krause, has set up a display in front of St. Joseph of things that pertain to the Passion of Christ: a scaled-down, but perfect, print of the Holy Shroud of Turin, a relic of the True Cross, the positive image of the Face of Christ from the Shroud, and a 2,000-year-old half-shekel of Tyre, which is believed to be the type of coin for the “thirty pieces of silver” that Judas was paid for his betrayal. Please feel free to visit the shrine and say a prayer. Additionally, I once again, I remind you of our schedule of Lenten exercises:

- A) Stations of the Cross, every Friday at 7:00PM, followed by...
- B) ...our Lenten Speaker Series
- C) Confessions every Tuesday from 1:00-1:30PM (in addition to 4:00PM Saturday); next week, with the beginning of Passiontide, we’ll have more times scheduled
- D) Daily Mass, including Saturday morning at 8:00AM
- E) Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday (all year long, but especially in Lent)

THE PASSION OF THE CHRIST

There will be a special showing of Mel Gibson’s masterpiece, *The Passion of the Christ*, in our lunchroom next Sunday afternoon at 3:00PM. All are welcome and there is no charge either for the movie or the soda which will be provided. I can’t think of a better way to set the tone for the most solemn time of the Church year.

PARTING IS SUCH SWEET SORROW

Our faithful parish secretary/receptionist of fourteen years, Peggy Brewer, has just informed me that she has taken a new position at Assumption Parish in O’Fallon (closer to her home) and will be leaving us toward the end of April. We will, of course, miss her greatly and certainly wish her well. Taking her place will be Linda Brindley, who has been rendering comparable service to our school for the past several years. There’s much more to say, but I will wait until later to say it. Until then, I just want to express how much we all appreciate what Peggy has done for us for the past several years.

AT LAST!

As you leave church today, do not fail to notice our new, carved oil wood crucifix, the one that many of you helped purchase with your generous offerings several months ago. It took a while to figure out exactly where to put it and to create the proper presentation for it, but I think we pulled it off exceedingly well. Some of the prep work was done by the great liturgical restoration artist, Michele Bowman of *Restorations Plus*, but the real heavy lifting was done by our own good parishioner, Jerry Ruchalski, who donated both materials and his own service to construct and mount the frame for the crucifix. It is intended to be a perfect, though smaller, complement to the main crucifix in the front of church, so that as you enter and leave our beautiful church, you are confronted with the image of Our Crucified Lord, which is as powerful a reminder as can be of the immense love the Father bears for us. I think it achieves that goal splendidly. Again, our thanks and blessings to all involved!

Palm Sunday Movie Afternoon at S.A.M

Please join us Sunday, April 9th, at 3:00 PM in the lunchroom for the showing of the movie **The Passion of the Christ**, the 2004 American epic biblical drama film directed by Mel Gibson and starring Jim Caviezel as Jesus Christ. The movie focuses on the last twelve hours of Jesus of Nazareth's life, beginning in the Garden of Olives, where Jesus went to pray after the Last Supper. He resists the temptations of Satan and, then, is betrayed by Judas Iscariot. Jesus is arrested and taken within the city walls of Jerusalem where leaders of the Pharisees confront him with accusations of blasphemy and his trial results in a condemnation to death. The movie is very graphic in its presentation of Jesus' sufferings, his sufferings for our offenses. Viewing this movie can serve as good preparation for realizing what Jesus suffered for us, which we commemorate on Good Friday.

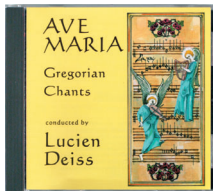
