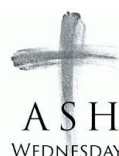

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT FEBRUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY FAMILY!

LENT, 2018

This Wednesday, Feb. 14, is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It is, of course, a day of abstinence from meat for all those 14 and older, and a day of fast for those who are 21-59. That's ecclesiastical law. In point of fact, everyone who can fast and abstain ought to. If Ash Wednesday means anything at all, it is that we are *all* sinners and need to repent from something; it's not just for bank robbers and axe-murderers. This year we will have all the traditional observances we've had in the past; they work so well it would be foolish not to continue them. They are: daily Mass at 8:00AM (including every Saturday during Lent), Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesdays from 8:30AM-7:00PM, Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 7:00PM (followed by our Lenten Speaker Series), Confessions on Saturdays from 4:00-4:45PM (extra times will be scheduled as we approach Holy Week), and Morning Prayer at 7:40AM Monday-Friday. The object of Lent is that we will have become different people on Easter Sunday from what we were on Ash Wednesday, better in at least two or three ways. The Church presents us with a golden opportunity. Let's not squander it!

POLISH/PHILLY FOOD NIGHT

Set the date: Saturday evening, March 3 (feast of St. Katharine Drexel of Philadelphia, and eve of St. Casimir of Poland). It's an evening of Polish cuisine, or, if you prefer, of the culinary arts of the City of Brotherly Love (or both!). After the 5:00PM Mass until 8:00PM, dinner is served in our parish gym, the Buckley/Montine Center. We now have the menu: Piekutowski's *Kielbasa* (with sauté onions, kraut, & potatoes), *Pierogi* (Polish dumplings), *Golabki* (stuffed cabbage roll), real Philly Cheese Steak (in the style of *Jim's* on 4th & South in Center City Philly), soft pretzels (the best you'll ever have!), Field Green Salad w/Boston Chicken, followed by *Kifli* (Polish fruit cookies), *Nutella Rugelach* (L'il cookie), Philly fluff cheesecake, and assorted spirits. It's all for a suggested offering of \$15 per person...a great mid-Lent respite from fasting!

False (*the body of any cold-blooded animal is not, for abstinence purposes, considered to be meat*) 8. True (*well, that's when your Lenten penances come to an end; there are those who will assert that season of Lent ends on Maundy Thursday, but you will still continue to fast throughout the Paschal Triduum, which comprises Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday*) 9. False (*but it is a wonderful idea and fruitful practice to do so*) 10. True

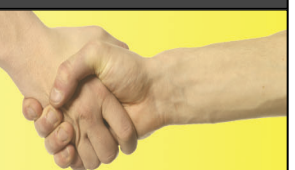
