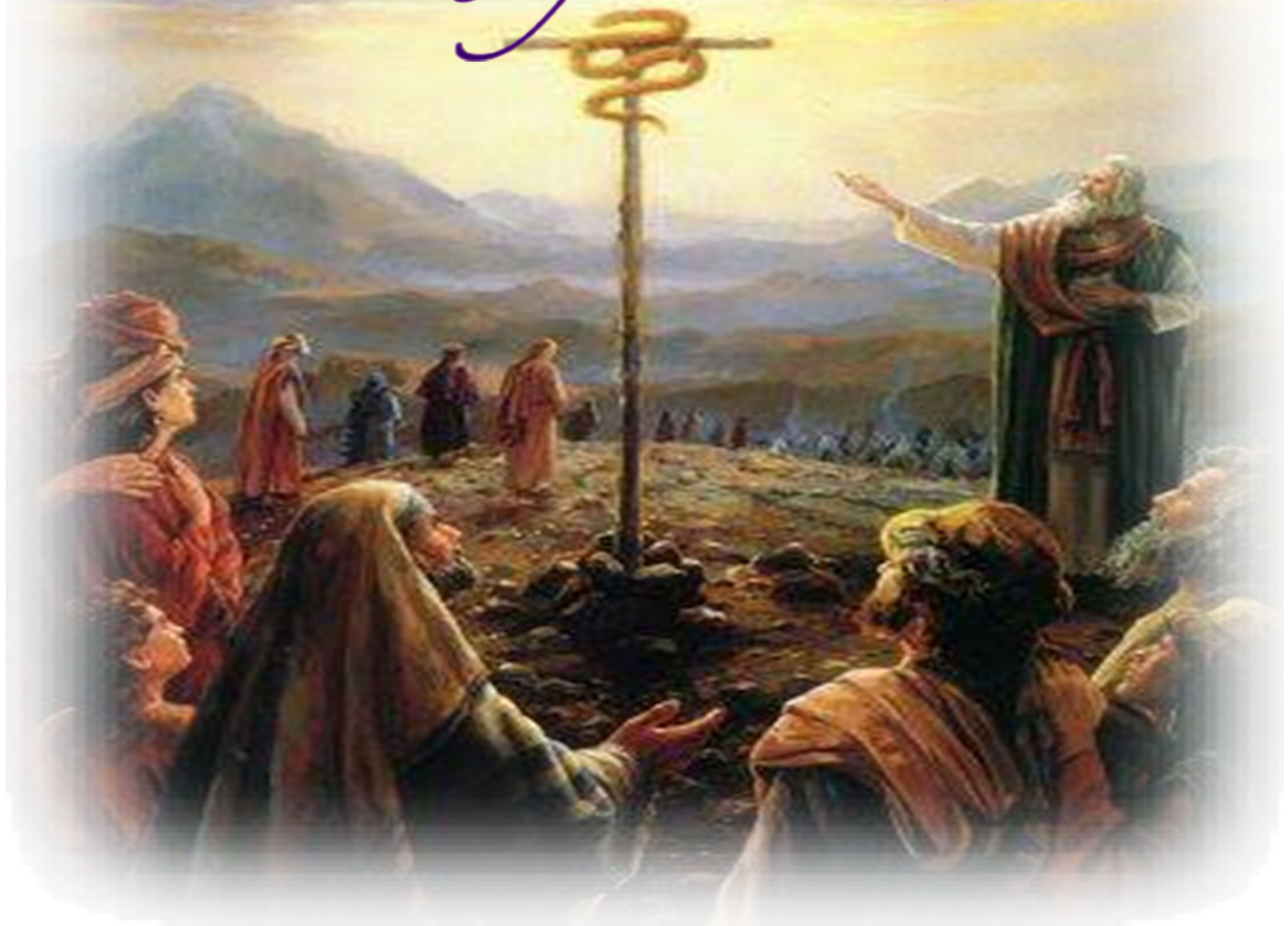

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT MARCH IS THE MONTH OF ST. JOSEPH!

LAETARE, HIEROSOLYMA!

This Sunday, the “Rose-colored” Sunday of Lent, is traditionally known as “Laetare Sunday”, from the opening words of today’s introit (entrance antiphon): “Laetare, Hierosolyma!” (“Rejoice, O Jerusalem!”). The color is *rose* (just as it is for Advent’s third Sunday) to represent the modified rejoicing we express for having kept a worthy penitential season that is now slightly more than half over. It’s also meant to serve to encourage us to be faithful in our Lenten discipline and exhort us to persevere in the face of all trials, whether self-imposed or part of the rigors of daily life.

ALABAMA, HERE WE COME!

It looks like our pilgrimage to the studios of EWTN is a go! We’ll leave St. Angela early in the morning on our new Marian feast day (May 21) and return the evening of the 24th. For only \$300 per person, you’ll get your bus transportation, hotel and breakfast. You will be responsible for your lunch, dinner, and any souvenirs/holy items you might want to purchase. Besides the EWTN shrine & studio, there will also be a stop at the mother-house of the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia in Nashville. There’s room for 55 and non-parishioners are welcome (but priority will be given to our own parishioners). You can book your place now in the parish office (checks payable to St. Angela Merici).

FIRST COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION...LOOKING AHEAD

I wish to announce that Archbishop Carlson has granted me the faculty to administer the sacrament of Confirmation to the young candidates from our parish who are not attending Catholic school. This will take place, most fittingly, on Pentecost Sunday (May 20) at the 11:30AM Mass. Also, our young parishioners who do attend Catholic school will be making their First Communion at our parish on Quasimodo Sunday (it’s the Sunday after Easter, and, yes, that’s what it’s really called), also at the 11:30 AM Mass.

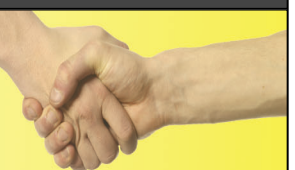
