From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY!

THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

This item is pretty much a reiteration of what I wrote in this same space last week, namely, a double-reminder: first, to remind you of how much the souls in purgatory *need* our prayers and sacrifices (and, at the same time, confirm just how helpful our prayers and sacrifices are), and, second, to point out the *obligation* we have, in charity, to make those prayers and sacrifices. There's probably no more alarming and destructive heresy than the one that so many Catholics have fallen for, namely, that people just march straight into heaven after their lives on earth. Would that this were so! Of course we do love our dear departed family members, but we're also painfully aware of their imperfections. Jesus made it very clear: there's no place in heaven for imperfection. Thanks be to God that He gives us the opportunity to make ourselves absolutely clean once we have "shuffled off this mortal coil". Do not squander of your chances to help our beloved dead to find their way home to paradise!

THE LISTS OF THE DEAD

It has become our custom each year to set up a listing of our parishioners who passed away since the previous November. The list is made up of those names registered in our parish funeral book, i.e., those who had their funeral Masses here at St. Angela this past year. (This is, frankly, the only way I really know for sure the names of our parishioners who died last year.) The list is printed up on parchment and put on display on our shrine to St. Joseph (he being the patron of a happy death). I certainly do not, however, wish to exclude *anyone*, so if you have a loved one who passed away in the last 12 months whose name is *not* on the list, please let me know (also, I ask you to correct any errors I may have made in spelling or dates). Please provide me with their *full* names and dates of death. Call the office, shoot me an e-mail, write me a letter, *whatever!* Please let me know!

STILL HONORING THE SAINTS

We at St. Angela celebrate our patron saints differently from the rest of the Archdiocese. Oh sure, the other parishes will slap together some corned beef and cabbage on St. Patrick's Day, but we honor the ethnic saints (well, a lot them, anyway) by serving their national foodstuffs on their feast days. Coming up shortly are the feasts of Sts. Rose Philippine Duchesne and Frances Cabrini, both Americans, but both also coming to us from foreign shores. 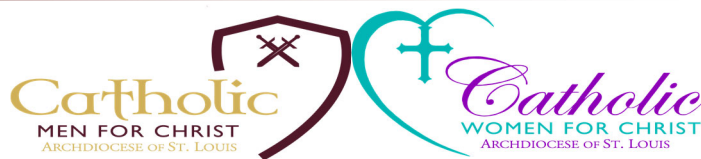

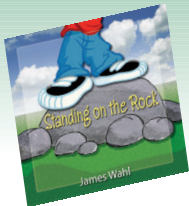
