November 1

What is it?

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day dedicated to the saints of the Church and all those who have reached heaven.

How is it observed?

A Catholic Holy Day of Obligation, all Catholics are required to attend mass. All Saints' Day is celebrated by honoring the saints by visiting their holy shrines and offering prayers seeking their intercession.



All Souls' Day
November 2

What is it?

All Souls' Day is dedicated to those who have departed from this world, and who wait in faith for the promised Resurrection.

How is it observed?

All Souls' Day is not a holy day of obligation, but is recognized in the Catholic Church on November 2. On this day, we pray for our loved ones to enter heaven.

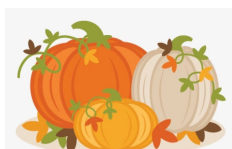

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

The devil *hates* the rosary! What better reason to pray it?

ALL SAINTS' DAY/ALL SOULS' DAY

Tomorrow (November 1) is All Saints' Day, the annual festival of the Heavenly Jerusalem. Normally, it would be a holy day of obligation, and rightly so. A few years ago, however, our bishops decided that when this feast occurs on a Monday or Saturday it is not observed as such. And, since tomorrow is a Monday, there's no canonical obligation to attend Mass. It is, however, one of the biggest feasts of the Catholic Church, and so there will be two Masses tomorrow; the usual one at 8:00AM and another one at 6:00PM. By celebrating this feast, we celebrate the feast day not just of the *canonized* saints, but especially of the *uncanonized*, i.e., the saints that we ourselves personally knew and who helped to shape our lives. Do you need a better reason to come?

Also, the next day, Tuesday, is the feast of the Holy Souls in purgatory, All Souls' Day. It's a day of prayer and fasting for the dead, and so there will be a special evening Mass that day as well. The regular 8:00AM Mass will again be celebrated, but there will be another one at 6:30PM. Eucharistic Adoration will, therefore, end at 6:30 on Tuesday. On the feast of the Holy Souls, it is customary to visit, decorate, and pray at the graves of our loved ones. Let's not squander this opportunity to do much good for those who are in great need of that good.

GERMANFEST!

The consensus is that this year's Germanfest was a major success, and I concur. Even if we didn't make any money at all, our parishioners and their families, and our neighbors at large who attended, all had a gloriously marvelous time, and that alone would have made all the work worthwhile. Everybody, however, is curious about how much money we did actually make. Before I reveal the number, I want to issue an official *gut erledigt und vielen dank* ("well done and many thanks") to ALL who took part. It was a powerful witness to all of the vibrancy of our parish and of all of North County as well! (Oh, and we did clear about \$8,700!)

As I mentioned earlier, we really have a treat for our St. Joseph Catholic Radio Speaker Series this Saturday after the 8:00AM Mass. Crystal Hansell, the recent St. Joseph Radio Catholic woman of the Year, is going to speak to us of her life story and current apostolate, and, man, is it impressive! Do not miss it!

Growing up in an abusive household, Crystal became the victim of child trafficking after being abandoned on an inner city street by her biological mother at the age of 12. After escaping the traffickers and helping the FBI with their arrest, Crystal's homeless life style took a toll on her physical and mental health, resulting in an extended hospitalization, during which she was befriended by a Christian security guard who kept reminding her that God would help her if she gave Him a chance. After release from the hospital, she started each day with prayer, while living under a bridge. It was here that Crystal started her non-profit ministry, **Jesus in Disguise**, through which she helps the poor, homeless, and addicts, both materially and spiritually. At an award dinner on September 26th, Crystal was honored as Catholic Woman of the Year for SJEN-St. Joseph Radio by Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski.

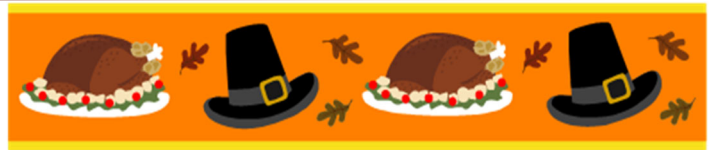
