

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY (pray for them!) AND DECEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION!

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

I find that as I get older, Advent has become progressively, more and more, a favorite time of year. Fraught with anticipation for the keeping of a divine promise, Advent has its own special appeal, which I find ever-increasingly thrilling. It has its own customs (Advent calendar, Jesse Tree, Vespers, etc.), its own sacramentals (Advent Wreath), its own colors (rose and violet), and its own saints (St. Nicholas, St. Lucy, etc.). It comes at the darkest time of the year and anticipates the arrival of the Light of the World. Who can resist its charm? As I say every year in my annual Advent schpiel: "Let Advent be Advent", i.e., don't capitulate to the *zeitgeist* and start celebrating Christmas, and one of the best ways to keep a good Advent is...

...ADVENT VESPERS

The Vespers of the First Sunday of Advent will be celebrated here this evening at 7:00PM. I hope you can all make it. It's become a traditional event here and people from all over North County come to worship the Lord and we celebrate the triumph of the light over the darkness by Him who is the Light of the World. Bring the kids and grandkids, too...they *love* it!


First Saturday, December 4th, 8:00 AM Mass Followed by Speaker Fred L. Vilbig
