From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT DECEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION AND JANUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY CHILDHOOD!

A MERRY CHRISTMAS TO ALL!

Because of Christmas' falling on a Saturday this year, this is my earliest occasion to wish you all a blessed feast and season of the Savior's Nativity. I especially wish you a blessed...

...FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

Today is that feast day, and it comes as a great blessing for God's people. It's sad to see the sacred institution of the family, established by God Himself to be the instrument through which we would all come to know Him by witnessing His love in action in the committed love of mom and dad, so horribly marginalized and besmirched. Original sin gave us the "sexual revolution" as one of its unholy excrescences, and it has all been made worse by silly government programs that subsidize the bad behaviors that lead to illegitimacy, and then punish those who had acted badly if they should try to behave responsibly. It needs to be made quite clear that the "marriage act" by which husband and wife express their committed love for one another and work with God to create new life, is for marriage. Frankly, we need the example of the Holy Family, celebrated on this blessed day, to teach us that the Domestic Church (i.e., the Catholic Home) is a holy thing and is to be, like every other holy thing, cherished and defended.

NEW YEAR'S DAY

Normally, when New Year's falls on a Tuesday through Friday, this would be a holy day of obligation. This year, however, since the feast falls on Saturday, it is not. Nevertheless, we will still offer Mass at 8:00AM on next Saturday, Jan. 1. There will be no evening Mass on New Year's Eve and we will not have the St. Joseph Radio speaker on Saturday. We will, however, have Mass at 5:00PM on New Year's Day, as usual.

AD ORIENTEM

Just like last year, the Christmas decorations for this year have filled the sanctuary to such a degree that I am obliged to offer Mass *ad orientem*, i.e., facing the same way as you. Believe it or not, this is the normal and presumed way that Mass is supposed to be celebrated. It's not that I'm "turning my back on you" (with all of its nasty connotations), rather I'm joining you in facing toward the east, i.e., toward the natural symbol of the Risen Christ, i.e., the Rising Sun. If you were to look closely at the instructions that are given to the celebrant in the Roman Missal (the big book of Mass prayers), in many cases it says: "turning toward the people, the priest says..." Now ask yourself; why should he "turn toward the people" is he's already facing them? The Missal assumes that he's not. If you don't care for this, be still and of good cheer; when the decorations are gone, we'll be back to what has become the "normal" way.

...AND SPEAKING OF THE DECORATIONS...

...our crew has outdone itself again! God bless them! We thank them with all our hearts. (And watch for another puzzle with the montage of pictures of our beautifully decorated church!)

FESTIVAL OF CAROLS

Don't forget our festival of the old, familiar Christmas Carols this afternoon (Sunday) at 1:00PM. It shouldn't last longer than an hour. I'll introduce each carol (the stories behind many of them are fascinating!) and then we'll sing, and when it's all over, we'll gather in the lunchroom for treats! What a way to spend a day with the Holy Family! Bring yours!

- 8. Which of the following is *not* a traditional way of celebrating New Year in some places: parades, boxing matches, dart championships, "polar bear plunges", horse races
- 9. Since "December" means "10th month", why do we call our 12th month that?
- 10. Whence does the word "calendar" derive?

ANSWERS: 1. No; the old Julian Calendar made it Mar.1 and many places retained that, while other places made it Dec. 25 (for Jesus), Mar. 25 (for Mary), or on Easter 2. The Divine Maternity of Mary (ecclesiastical Mother's' Day) 3. The Circumcision of Our Lord 4. World Day of Peace 5. Because it's named for the pagan god Janus, who had two faces; one looking backward and one forward. It seemed a good symbol of starting a new year and leaving the old one behind 6. Because it's springtime and the earth is coming back to life and being reborn 7. Yes, quite a few, actually, the most prominent one being St. Odo (or "Odilo"), the 11th c. abbot of Cluny, who gave us the feast of All Souls' Day 8. Boxing matches 9. Because when the year began in March, December was the tenth month 10. From the Latin word kalendae or calendae, which was the name the Romans gave to the first day of every month


