From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY!

THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

There are two kinds of prayer, verbal and mental. Verbal prayer occurs when we talk to God, whether it's spoken out loud or in the quiet of our own minds, whether it's mumbled, shouted or sung, alone or with others, what makes it "verbal" is that *we* are talking to *God*. Mental prayer occurs when God speaks to us and we are receptive of what He has to say. Both are important and every Catholic should regularly engage in both, but of the two, mental prayer is obviously superior. What we have to say to God pales to insignificance compared to what He has to say to us. When we dispose ourselves to the Presence of God, then, the wisest move is to shut up and listen. One of the most practical, easy, and effective ways of listening to that still, quiet voice of the Almighty is through the rosary. By meditating on its mysteries as we pray the Our Fathers and Hail Marys, we come into contact with Him who is all wisdom and enlightenment, and are more receptive to what He has to tell us. The beautiful thing is that ever since the rosary was first prayed in the 12th/13th c., billions of Catholics have been able to hear the divine Voice and have become holy in the process. And in most cases, they were oblivious to how holy they had become! It's amazing how something so simple and easy can have such dramatic effect. Pray yours all through this holy month.

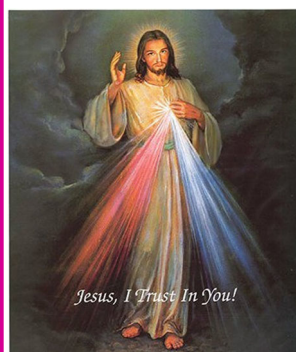

Growing up in an abusive household, Crystal became the victim of
child trafficking after being abandoned on an inner city street by her
biological mother at the age of 12. After escaping the traffickers and
helping the FBI with their arrest, Crystal's homeless life style took a
toll on her physical and mental health, resulting in an extended
hospitalization, during which she was befriended by a Christian
security guard who kept reminding her that God would help her if
she gave Him a chance. After release from the hospital, she started
each day with prayer, while living under a bridge. It was here that
Crystal started her non-profit ministry, **Jesus in Disguise**, through
which she helps the poor, homeless, and addicts, both materially and
spiritually. At an award dinner on September 26th, Crystal was
honored as Catholic Woman of the Year for SJEN-St. Joseph Radio by
Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski.
