Most of the time, they look at our parish church somewhat wistfully, with the sigh that "I wish our church was done this well!" Well, we *know* what we have here and are most grateful for all who made it possible, from the decorators to the benefactors. We are definitely planning to turn the photos of the decorations into a jigsaw puzzle again (we'll let you know when it's time to place your order); but so many have suggested that we should make Christmas cards out of them that we're looking into that as well! GOING LIKE 60

As you know, 2022 marks the 60th anniversary of the founding of St. Angela Merici Parish. On July 18, 1962, Fr. Paul Kersgieter got a letter from Cardinal Ritter telling him that he must form a new parish in the wilds of North County. And he did. Now, 60 years and four pastors later, we're celebrating our diamond jubilee. The big kickoff will be on Thursday evening, January 27, the actual feast of St. Angela Merici. We'll start with Mass at 5:00PM and follow that with a wonderful Italian dinner (to honor our Italian patroness), with music from alive band. It should be a great time for all! Make your reservations now! (The **BIG** celebration will take place on July 18, the *actual* anniversary day; plan on coming to that, too!)

CHRISTMAS THANKS

It's as necessary to thank all of you for kindness to me, the staff, and the parish this past Christmas as it is impossible to reach everyone individually. And so I say, collectively, thank you very, very much for your kindness to us all, and prayers and blessings for us all this past Christmas!

Special thanks to all who serve us directly. I'm talking about our staff, the members of the various parish organizations, the ushers, servers, & lectors and all who volunteer and give so much, sharing their gifts and talents with the Church at large. That's how God's Kingdom operates, and the selflessly generous cooperation is what makes it God's Kingdom (and that's how we build it here on earth)!

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

This Sunday is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the very first day of the season we call "Ordinary Time". I dare say that with very few exceptions, everybody who will visit us this weekend has been baptized. Let's make that, therefore, the topic of this weeks "Quiz-a-Catholic":

1. Who is able to baptize validly?
2. Can non-baptized, non-Catholics baptize?
3. What must a baptizer do in order to make the baptism he's administering valid?
4. What is the proper form/formula to use in baptism?
5. Is it necessary to have sponsors, i.e., "godparents"?
6. How many godparents does one need?
7. Besides the essential sign of the flowing water, what other signs are used in the rite?
8. When a child is baptized *in articulo mortis* and survives, is anything else done to him?

9. How long after birth should an infant be baptized?
10. What does “gossip” have to do with Baptism?

ANSWERS: 1. Anybody 2. I said, “Anybody”, and I meant it. 3. He must have the intentions of the Church (i.e., the salvation of the person being baptized), use some kind of flowing water (immersion counts, sprinkling doesn’t, and it has to be water and not just any old viscous fluid), and use the proper formula 4. The one given us by the Lord Himself in St. Matthew’s Gospel, viz., while pouring water on (or dunking) the baptizand, he says: “I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit” 5. Not absolutely; one wouldn’t in the case of an emergency baptism, but in the normal case, of course 6. Church law only requires one “sponsor” (who may be of either sex), but the custom is to have two (and no more) 7. Consecrated oil (two kinds: Chrism and the Oil of the Catechumens), a white garment, and a burning candle 8. Typically, when the child is well enough, he is brought to church for the “supplying of the ceremonies”, i.e., the application of the other signs mentioned in #7 9. When in articulo mortis, right away; otherwise, four to six weeks is the norm, but he could be baptized any time after birth 10. Believe it or not, the old English word “gossip” is what the “godparents” used to be called, it being a portmanteau contraction of “god-siblings” into “god-sibs”, or simply “gossips” (and maybe they started talking about each other at the party afterward)


