### REMEMBER THAT DECEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION!

#### **REJOICE!** (...but not too much!)

This third Sunday of Advent, the rose-colored one, is a time for modified rejoicing. The tough, penitential season of Advent is now more than half-over and the goal of Christ's Birth is well in view (but we're still not there yet and there's work yet to be done). That makes it a time for modified rejoicing, which is expressed by the use of the color rose. And so the rose-colored candle is lit and every Catholic thereby knows that the Lord is near. (I appreciate all of you for humoring me and not calling it "pink"!)

#### **ADVENT VESPERS**

The third of the Evening Prayer (or "Vespers") for Advent will be celebrated this Sunday night at 7. There are still two more to go, and each one does wonders for establishing your sense of this holy season. Come and join us (even if you missed the first two!).

#### ADVENT IS A TIME FOR RECONCILIATION

There will be many extra times for the great sacrament of Confession all throughout the Advent season (in addition to the usual Confession time on Saturday afternoon from 4:00-4:45PM). This week, I'll be hearing confessions on Tuesday, Dec. 13, from 6:30-7:00PM, and Thursday, Dec. 15 after the 8:00AM Mass and from 6:00-6:30PM.

#### PILGRIMAGE TO ITALY (UPDATE)

I heard back from our new travel agent and the numbers he's coming up with are significantly higher than expected. Apparently, a lot of people who couldn't travel previously are now able to and are filling up the hotels & airplanes.
