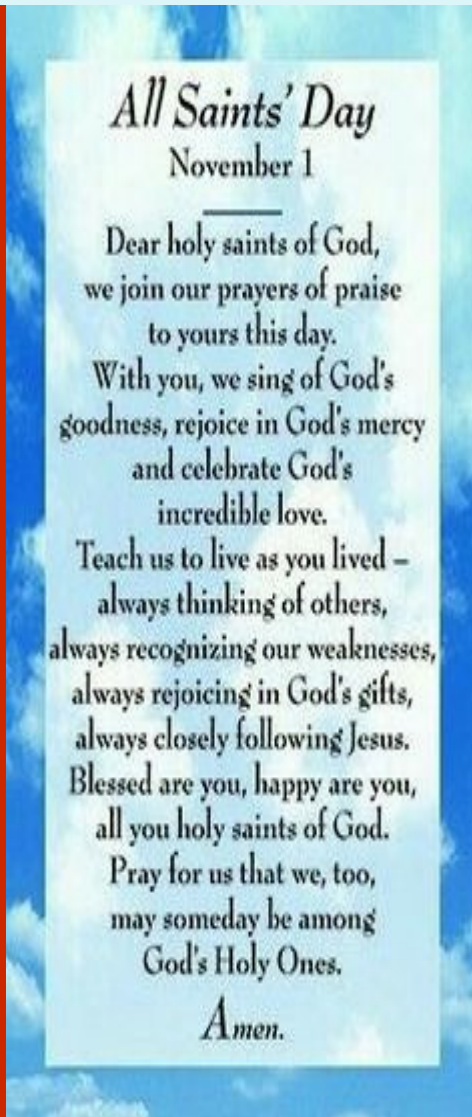

THE FEAST OF ALL THE HOLY ONES, THE HEAVENLY JERUSALEM

This Wednesday, Nov. 1, is, as you know, All Saints' Day, the festival established by holy mother Church to honor *every* saint, the un-canonized as well as the canonized. It is, as it should be, a holy day of obligation, and so our parish will have Mass on Tuesday the 31st (Hallowe'en) at 7:00PM (closing out the adoration period) and at 8:00AM & 5:00PM on Wednesday, the feast day itself. Do not pass up this opportunity to celebrate the feast of your loved ones in heaven!

ROMA!

On Monday (Oct. 30), I'll be leading a contingent of our parishioners on a pilgrimage to the "trophies" (as they're called) of the Apostles Peter & Paul, in the city and country where they established the Church and ultimately shed their blood. I'm talking about the Eternal City, Rome. We'll be gone about 11 days. While I'm gone, Mass and all the other spiritual exercises will go on as usual (except for my Catechism Class on Tuesday, Nov. 7, which is cancelled). In my place, our good friend, Fr. Alex Anderson, will offer the weekday and holy day Masses, and our Administrator, Fr. Peter Faimega, will cover the Sunday Masses and confessions.
