REMEMBER THAT NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY!

THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

As the second book of the Maccabees tells us, it is a "suitable and honorable thing" to offer prayers and, most of all, sacrifices for the dead, so that "the sins they have committed might be completely blotted out". In her piety, Mother Church adjures us to pray for the dead at all times, but especially in this month of November. The Church has always reckoned it a spiritual work of mercy to do so. Not too long ago, someone gave me a book on purgatory. Just about all of it comprised accounts of individuals' revelations of their locutions from and dealings with the souls in purgatory. The vast majority of the people quoted were either canonized saints or other pious souls whom the Church holds in high regard. What they describe is literally hair-raising! Although these constitute private revelations, and the Church obliges no Catholic to put faith in private revelations no matter what the source, even if only 10% of these stories are true, they'll knock your socks off! The two things that come through in just about every version is that the souls in purgatory are *desperate* for our prayers and that the prayers we pray and the sacrifices we offer for them and *powerfully* effective. Do not pass up this opportunity to do both yourself and your beloved dead a magnificent favor: pray for them!

The Year of Grace 2023 is coming to an end, and we will see it no more except in memory. We will follow our longstanding custom of celebrating the Vespers of Advent's four Sundays in grand style. Plan on coming and singing in the Vesper Choir!

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

Since the month of the holy saints and holy souls is upon us, let's make this quiz on the afterlife:

- 1. What are the "four last things"?
- 2. How many judgements will there be?
- 3. In the Apostles' Creed, we say Jesus "descended into hell"; did He really go there?
- 4. What is purgatory?
- 5. What does the word "purgatory" mean?
- 6. Is purgatory mentioned in the Bible?
- 7. Is it possible to leave purgatory?
- 8. Is it possible to leave hell?
- 9. Is there a difference between the demons (who are fallen angels) and the damned humans in hell?
- 10. Is there a place after death other than heaven, hell, and purgatory?

ANSWERS: 1. Death, judgement, heaven and hell 2. Two; the particular judgement that each of us faces right after death and the general judgement of every human being at the end of time 3. Not to the hell which is the abode of the damned, but to a special place where the noble fathers of the Old Testament waited for the Redemption of Christ 4. A place where those who died in venial sin may atone for the temporal punishment accrued by the sins they committed in life. 5. Literally, it means a "bathroom", i.e., a place of cleansing 6. Not as such (and for it to be a matter of faith, it doesn't have to be, since Sacred Tradition is just as valid as Scripture as a source of faith), but there are references, e.g., 2 Maccabees 12:39-46 and Mt. 12:32, where Jesus speaks of sins being forgiven in the "age to come" 7. Absolutely; the departure from it is,

apparently, a gradual process 8. No 9. Apparently there is; angels are a higher order of being that we are, and that difference apparently expresses itself in the daily existence in hell, with the demons making the subsistence of life for humans there, well, a pure hell!

10. Yes, it's a place traditionally called "limbo" (see the answer to #3 above) where Christ descended after His death, the abode of the Old Testament fathers. It has been speculated that another such place exists for those who die without Baptism, but we really don't know and that's the subject of some future quiz...
