MASS INTENTIONS

If you would like to have a Mass celebrated for a loved one— deceased or living—contact Linda at the Parish Office at 314-838-6565 or stop by the office. The stipend is \$10 per Mass. There are infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefits one's soul. The special ministerial fruits of the Mass are applied to the particular intention of the Mass. We have MANY open dates and times! The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, originated in the very early Church. We have Mass Cards available in the office you can give to the family of a deceased person or Special Intention Cards for living, for a special occasion or for healing.

REMEMBER THAT DECEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION! VESPERS!

A) We will celebrate them on all the Sundays of Advent, starting today (with the exception that, since the fourth Sunday of Advent is Christmas Eve, the last of the Vespers will be on Thursday, Dec. 21 instead). They start at 7:00PM, all are welcome, of course. (The little ones especially love this ceremony, and for many, it becomes one of the cherished memories of youth.)

B) If you would like to help chant the prophecies for Vespers, do the following: 1) Put on a white top with a black (or dark) bottom, 2) arrive at the lunchroom by 6:15 for rehearsal (what you're singing is the same as all previous years), and 3) walk in the candlelight procession into church (or if you'd rather not, we'll seat you in church beforehand)

FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION (Holy day of obligation)

Even at this late date, many American Catholics still do not realize that the Blessed Mother, under the title of Immaculate Conception, is the patroness of our country. Her annual feast day, Dec. 8, is, therefore, *doubly* a holy day of obligation for us; first, it's a holy day for the whole Catholic world, and second, because she's our patroness. Masses will be celebrated for the feast day this Thursday, Dec. 7, at 7:00PM, and on Friday, Dec. 8, at 8:00AM & 5:00PM.
