ONE LAST WORD ON HOLY WEEK

This is my first opportunity to express, publicly and in print, the gratitude of the whole parish to our servers, lectors, ushers, choir members and musicians, and deacon, for the wonderful job they did at divine service this past Holy Week and Triduum. Everything went extraordinarily smoothly and reverentially. God was truly praised, and His people immensely edified! Special thanks and praise goes to our decorators, who once again provided (and are providing still) the ambience most fitting to the season and events celebrated. People literally cross state lines to visit our Gethsemane on Maundy Thursday and take *thousands* of pictures of our magnificently decorated church. THE DIVINE MERCY

Based on the apparitions of Jesus Christ to the Polish nun, St. Faustina Kowalska, we now have established the Second Sunday of Easter (aka, "The Sunday of the Octave of Easter", aka, "Low Sunday", aka, "Quasimodo Sunday") to be "Divine Mercy Sunday", replete with special prayers and services. The reason for this wonderful observance is to challenge us to confront whatever sinfulness remains in us, while, at the same time, reminding us of the deep, personal, and overwhelming compassion that Jesus has for us despite it. In addition to the talks and prayers, one of the main features of the observance is a chance to go to Confession. Since so many of our neighboring parishes are having the services this afternoon (Sunday), we are not going to compete with them. I exhort you to take part; it may be the salvation of your soul!

JOIN US IN ITALY!

I am leading a pilgrimage to Italy later this year, in the Fall (specifically, Oct. 30 – Nov. 9), and I hope that you can join us! 
