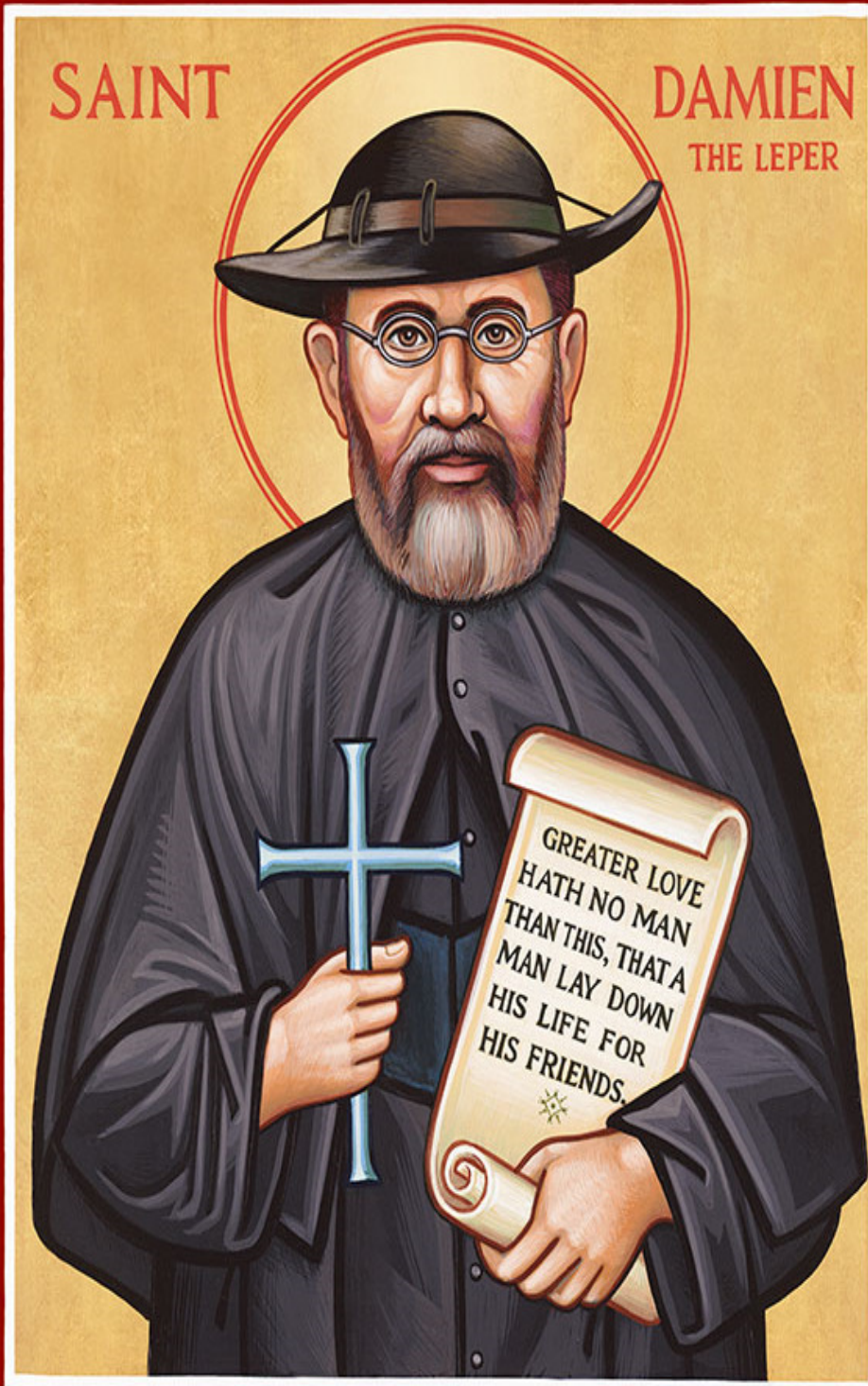

This lovely month is given over, in our catholic piety, to the Sinless Mother of God. It's no coincidence that Mothers' Day falls during this month and the very last day of May is the very significant Marian feast of her Visitation to Elizabeth (it used to be the feast of St. Angela Merici!). It's a time for May pageants and praying the rosary. The more we honor Mary, the more we honor Christ, who gave her to us to be our Mother.

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

This being the month of Our Lady, this quiz will be about her. Just how well do you know the Sinless One? Find out:

1. Who were Mary's parents?
2. When was Mary born?
3. Where was Mary born and raised?
4. When did Mary die?
5. What day is observed by the Church as her birthday?
6. From where was Mary assumed into heaven?
7. When was the first Marian apparition?
8. What does the name "Mary" mean?
9. Under which of her titles is she the patroness of the United States?
10. Do relics of Mary exist?

ANSWERS: 1. *Ss. Joachim and Anne* 2. *Ca. 20BC (the exact date is unknown)* 3. *She was probably born in Jerusalem, but Nazareth and Sephoris also have strong claims. In any case, she eventually made her way to Nazareth* 4. *Ca. 45AD* 5. *Sept. 8 (nine months after her Immaculate Conception)* 6. *Either Ephesus or Jerusalem* 7. *In 352 AD she appeared in a dream to an elderly Roman couple, asking them to have the Basilica of St. Mary Major built in Rome, but her first recorded physical apparition was to a Saxon noblewoman, Richeldis de Faverches, in Walshingham, England, in 1061AD* 8. *It's derived from one of two Hebrew words: "Marah" (which means "myrrh"), or "Miryam" (which means "bitter")* 9. *Immaculate Conception* 10. *There are no first-class relics of her (these would be actual parts of her body), but many ancient churches in Europe claim to have articles of her clothing (2nd-class relics), e.g., a sash, girdle, veil, etc. (and anything touched to a first or second-class relic becomes a third-class relic)*
