QUOTE OF THE WEEK

"HOW TO LIVE IN PEACE. A lot of people love Apple computers and would never use a PC. For others, it's just the opposite. Despite these strongly-held preferences, there's no conflict. We never see Apple computer lovers picketing firms that serve PC lovers and vice-versa. The reason is simple: whatever your preference is, you can get what you want.

Contrast the harmony that emerges when there's market allocation with the discord that happens when there's government allocation. For example, some parents want their children to go to a school that has

prayer and others are offended by that idea. Both parents have a right to their tastes, but these parental differences have given rise to conflict.

Why is there conflict? Again, there's a simple answer: schools are run by the government. Thus, there is going to be either prayer in the schools or no prayer in the schools, and the parent who wins gets his choice and the other parent loses; his choice is out the window. The only recourse the loser has is to pony up a fortune and send his kids to a private school (while still being taxed to support the public school his kids don't attend).

The liberty-oriented solution to the public school prayer issue is also simple: just because there's public *financing* of education doesn't mean that there has to be public *production* of it. The government finances F-18 fighters but doesn't produce them. Why can't the government take the same approach to schools?

If the government spends \$15,000 per student annually, it could simply give parents a voucher worth that amount for the school of their choice. That way, every parent would be free to choose: you can send your kids to the public non-prayer school, and I can send my kids to the school that allows prayer. We both win, so there's no reason to fight, and we can all sit down together and have a beer.

Free-market allocation is *conflict-reducing*, while government allocation is *conflict-enhancing*. But I'm afraid that most Americans want to be able to impose their preferences on others. The issue of prayer in school is a minor example of people's taste for tyranny.

This of the conflict that would arise if the government decreed that factories would only be allowed to manufacture PC,s and not Mac's. Can you imagine how otherwise peacefully-minded people would be forced into conflict with one another? Government allocation is mostly a *zero-sum game*, in which one person's win necessarily means the other person's loss. The great (and largely ignored) feature of market allocation is that it is what is called in game theory a *positive sum game*. In positive-sum games, everybody gets what he wants; my win doesn't happen at your expense, and your win doesn't cause my loss. Most important: we can all be friends!" – *Columnist, professor, and economist, the late Dr. Walter Williams*
