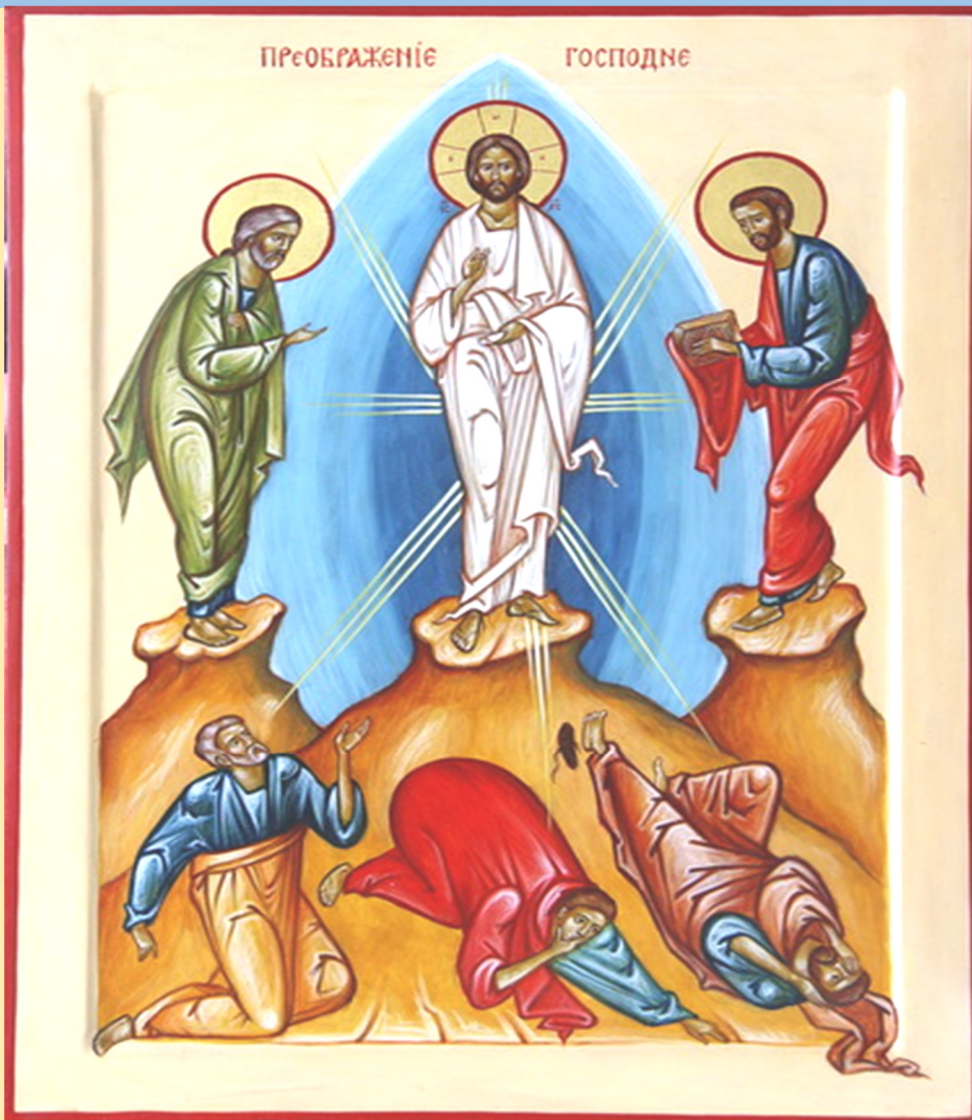

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT AUGUST IS THE MONTH OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

ON APPEAL

As many of you already know, our parish has appealed to the Vatican the decision made by the Archdiocese of St. Louis to merge our parish with St. Norbert's and Holy Name of Jesus. The case will soon be at the papal court in Rome (if it isn't there already) and will be adjudicated in due time. How long will it take? I don't know. How does it affect what is currently going on here? Again, I can't say. I suspect that things will continue to go, at least for the next few months, as they have gone for the past several years, with a gradual blending of the parishioners in various activities to the extent that you, the flock, are willing to blend. Frankly, I have never done, or been a part of, anything like this before. We'll have to wait and see.

THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY

This year, the Feast of Our Lady's Assumption falls on a Tuesday, and it is, therefore, a holy day of obligation. We will have Mass on Monday evening, Aug. 14 and at 8:00AM and 7:00PM on the feast day itself. Please note that we will have Eucharistic Adoration as usual, except that the adoration will conclude with the 7:00PM Mass, and not with Benediction.

CLERGY SCHEDULE

Next week, I will be the celebrant at all the Masses here at St. Angela. The weekend after that (Aug. Aug. 19 & 20) I will be at Holy Name of Jesus and our new associate, Fr. Samuel will be here.

10. Name the abortionist who oversaw 60,000 abortions and performed 5,000 personally, who converted from Judaism, became Catholic, and spent the rest of his life as an eloquent defender and promoter of the pro-life cause.

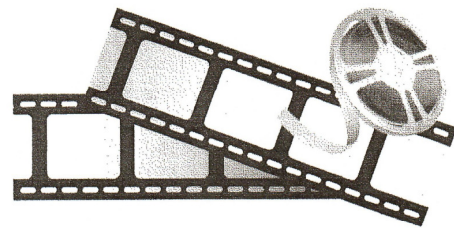
