REMEMBER: JANUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY CHILDHOOD OF JESUS! FRANCISCAN CRECHE INDULGENCE

This being the 800th anniversary of the first-ever Christmas creche (aka, Nativity Scene), orchestrated by St. Francis of Assisi, the pope has declared a special plenary indulgence to those who make a pilgrimage to a Franciscan creche some time in this Christmas season. The Christmas season, for the purpose of crechevisiting, has been extended to Feb. 2. I am organizing a pilgrimage to the creche located at the motherhouse of the Franciscan Sisters of the Martyr St. George, located about 20 minutes away in Alton (and easy to find). Part of the process of obtaining the indulgence involves a recent reception of the sacrament of Confession. That being the case, I propose the following: 1) the date is Wednesday, Jan. 31, leaving St. Angela at 10:00AM 2) I will make myself available after the 8:00AM Mass for Confession (but encourage you to make yours, if possible, on one of the two Saturdays before then, just to save time) 3) we will car pool up to Alton, and, upon arriving at the motherhouse, offer prayers for the intentions of the pope 4) we will then have a brief visit with the sisters and some refreshments after 5) then you're on your own getting back to St. Louis
