FRANCISCAN CRECHE INDULGENCE

As I mentioned in this space last week, we will be making a pilgrimage to the Motherhouse of the Franciscan Sisters of the Martyr St. George to obtain the plenary indulgence imparted by Pope Francis to any such pilgrims who visit a Franciscan creche in this 800th anniversary year of the first creche by St. Francis himself. This will take place on Wednesday, Jan. 31, with us meeting here at St. Angela at 10:00AM and then carpooling to the motherhouse in Alton. In order to obtain the indulgence, one must have recently gone to Confession. I will make myself available after the 8:00AM Mass that day for that purpose. Also, one must have also recently received Holy Communion, which can be accomplished at the 8:00AM Mass that day. One must also be free even from venial sin (you're on your own for that one), and pray for the intentions of the pope (which we will take care of at the creche). No reservations necessary; just show up here on the 31st.

PRAYERS FOR THE UNBORN

Even though the Supreme Court finally ruled appropriately on the abortion question, the issue is still not settled in the right way. There are many battles to fight to keep the murder of the innocent unborn illegal in Missouri, then the whole country, then the whole world. The battle will not really be won until the hearts of minds of all come to the just and righteous conviction that abortion is wrong. This Monday is still the anniversary of the infamous *Roe v. Wade* decision, which stands, along side of the Dred Scott case, as one of several outrages dumped on our nation by its highest court. - **3. Decline to Sign:** If the ballot initiative language is "certified" so that proabortion supporters can start collecting signatures, <u>DO NOT SIGN</u> any petition to allow abortion to be enshrined in the state constitution on the November 2024 ballot.
- **4. Promote Voter Registration:** Encourage young people and other new voters to register. Help at a registration drive in your community or ask your pastor if you can organize one at your parish.
- **5. Help Those Wounded by Abortion:** Encourage those affected by abortion to reach out for compassionate help and healing at archstl.org/hope-healing.
