LENT IS ON THE HORIZON

There's also plenty of opportunities to repent and start new and healthy habits of spiritual growth and renewal. Consider your own body; every day it replenishes itself by creating new cells. Every day you are physically renewed. If your body ever fails to reproduce itself in this way, you die. So, too, with your soul. It either refreshes itself or it dies. Let's not squander this occasion of grace. There will be extra Masses and the Stations of the Cross all through the holy season. Let's start making resolutions now for a good and holy Lent.


