THE HOLY TRINITY

On the two Sundays after Pentecost, the Church bids us to celebrate and contemplate the two greatest mysteries of our faith, namely, the fact that God is simultaneously both God and man (this week, Trinity Sunday) and that Jesus Christ is truly present under the appearance of bread and wine in the Blessed Sacrament (next week, Corpus Christi). As the great theologian Matthias Scheeben pointed out, if God were not mysterious, he just simply wouldn't be God. We rejoice in the fact that, even though God knew we would never understand these mysteries, He decided to share them with us, anyway, so that we might have not just knowledge of Him, but *intimate* knowledge of Him. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit!

CORPUS CHRISTI

Next week: Corpus Christi! Not only do we celebrate that great mystery at all the Masses next weekend, in addition, we also have the historic, immemorial, and fructifying tradition of the great Florissant Corpus Christi Procession! It starts at Sacred Heart at 7:00PM and involves the carrying of the Blessed Sacrament through the streets of Old Town to the historic Shrine of St. Ferdinand (a trip of only half a mile and downhill most of the way!). As we march, we sing and then stop along the way to give the holy Benediction. There will be treats afterward, and shuttle service back to Sacred Heart at the end. It's a wonderful expression of St. Louis Catholicism; bring the family and be a part of it!

MEMORIAL DAY

This weekend, our country honors those who gave their lives in the defense of our freedom. Tomorrow is the great Memorial Day, and, as is our custom, Mass will be at 9:00AM.

SIXTY YEARS!

Friday, June 21, is the 60th anniversary of the dedication of St. Angela Merici parish church. Fr. Kersgieter, our founding pastor, invited Cardinal Ritter to come out and dedicate the new church of the new parish that had just been founded two years earlier. And so on Fathers' Day of 1964 (June 21), His Eminence came all the way north and provided that service. We probably should have some kind of special celebration in honor of that great event.
