From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER: JUNE IS THE MONTH OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS!

CORPUS CHRISTI

"The smoke of Satan has entered the sanctuary of the Church," declared Pope St. Paul VI shortly after the Second Vatican Council concluded. All the expectant hopes for a grand renewal of the Church seemed to evaporate, as many of the anchors that held the Church together for many centuries seemed then to be set adrift, and things of which we had always been sure and never doubted were, all of a sudden, up for grabs. Consequently, in the fog of haze of uncertainty, many beautiful devotions of the faith were set aside as no longer "relevant". Sad to say, one of those was the faithful expression of respect for the Blessed Sacrament, as manifested in such things as the Forty Hours Devotions and the Corpus Christi procession. Ah, the Corpus Christi procession! Florissant had had such a procession from Sacred Heart to St. Ferdinand, I was told back in the 80's, and it went on for over 100 years! Then, it was gone. But the Holy Spirit is alive in the Church and the ancient and ever-new faith rekindles! I was so edified upon my return to North County ten years ago to learn that not only has the procession been restored, but that it was back stronger and more beautiful than ever! Don't miss this year's procession. It's a magnificent way to show the community the depth and strength of our Catholic faith. It starts at Sacred Heart at 7:00PM and winds up a half mile later at the St. Ferdinand Shrine. (Refreshments and shuttles await those who make it to the Shrine.)

INSTALLATION OF PASTOR

On Sunday, June 16, at the 11:30 Mass, Archbishop Rozanski will visit our parish and formally install Fr. Faimega as "pastor" of St. Angela Merici Parish (he currently holds the title of "administrator" of the parish).


