

IN GRATITUDE

It's truly overwhelming how many really good people come together to make our parish the wonderful community that it is. I think of that every time I walk past our parochial gardens and see our green-thumbed horticulturalists busy at work arranging, weeding, fertilizing, removing and planting all the flora that beautify our parish grounds so well. The Gardens of St. Angela are a local phenomenon, and everybody talks about them. It's all part of the welcoming spirit of the people of our parish, which is also something that everybody also talks about. That vibrant sense of community doesn't just happen; it takes many years of good people coming together in the sight of God to praise Him and to do whatever they can to establish a portion of His Kingdom here, tucked away in a small corner of North County. One can only say, "Thank you", to God and His people here at our wonderful parish.

MASS IN HONOR OF GOD THE FATHER

For the past ten years, our parish has always hosted the annual Mass in honor of God the Father, celebrated in response to a private revelation to Mother Eugenia, on the first Sunday of August. That Mass will be celebrated again this year, and I will be the celebrant, but it will not be celebrated here at St. Angela. For many reasons (mostly logistical) it will be celebrated at the old St. John Bosco church (located close to Creve Coeur Lake), mostly because of its more central location. Mass will start at 1:00PM and refreshments will be served after.
