Communion of Saints Devotion

The month of November has traditionally been a time when the Church celebrates the Communion of Saints, prays for those who have died, and prepares us to welcome the one St. Francis called "Sister Death". In keeping with this tradition, we will be creating Communion of Saints devotion areas, on which we will honor, not only some recognized Saints of the Church but our loved ones who have gone before us. We are inviting families to share with us a photograph (in a frame if possible) of loved ones who have died. In order to design the devotional spaces, we ask photos be turned into the Parish Office or brought to the sacristy of the church by October 26th

All photos will be returned in December.

The apostles said to the Lord: "Increase our faith." Luke 17: 5

Asking for our faith to be strengthened and increased may be one of the most honest and beautiful prayers we can pray. It acknowledges we are humble servants of our loving God, in need of God's grace and that our journey of discipleship is ongoing. When we begin to think we have it all together and don't need the Lord, we are no longer open to the Lord's working in our lives.

Our Gospel for this Sunday focuses on faith and service, as Jesus teaches His disciples about the nature of true discipleship. When the apostles ask Jesus to "increase our faith." Jesus responds by emphasizing that even faith as small as a mustard seed can achieve the impossible, such as uprooting a mulberry tree and planting it in the sea. This highlights that faith is not about quantity but about trust and surrender to God's power.

Jesus also uses the parable of the servant to remind His followers that discipleship involves humility and selfless service. Just as a servant does not expect special recognition for doing their duty, we are called to serve God and others without seeking reward or praise. Our faith should inspire us to act with love, obedience, and humility, trusting that God's grace will sustain us.

This week, we can take time to ask ourselves, where do I need to grow in my faith, in my trust, in my surrender to the Lord? Do I trust God fully, even when my faith feels small? Am I serving others with a humble heart, or do I seek acknowledgment? Faith is not just intellectual belief but a lived trust in God's promises, expressed through our actions and service.

Let us pray for the grace to deepen our faith and live as true disciples, always ready to serve with love and humility,



Anointing of the Sick:

"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven."

-James 5:14-15

Throughout his public ministry, Jesus healed the sick physically, mentally and spiritually. The apostles continued this ministry and handed it on to their successors. For 2,000 years, the Church has continued Jesus' ministry of healing through the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**.
