## MASS INTENTIONS

If you would like to have a Mass celebrated for a loved one—deceased or living—contact Linda at the Parish Office at 314-838-6565 or stop by the office. The stipend is \$10 per Mass. There are infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefits one's soul. The special ministerial fruits of the Mass are applied to the particular intention of the Mass. We have MANY open dates and times! The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, originated in the very early Church. We have Mass Cards available in the office you can give to the family of a deceased person or Special Intention Cards for living, for a special occasion or for healing.



## Pondering With Deacon George:

**“Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind are seeing, the lame are walking, the lepers are being healed, the deaf are hearing, the dead are being raised, and the poor are hearing good news.”**

In our gospel passage this weekend John the Baptist is in prison. He had spent his life preparing people for the Messiah. He baptized Jesus. He saw the Spirit come down like a dove. He knew Jesus was someone special. But now, sitting in a dark prison, he starts to have doubts. Things probably didn't turn out the way he expected. He hears about Jesus and sends some of his followers to ask Him, “Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?” Jesus doesn't just say, “Yes, I'm the one.” He says, “Look at what's happening. Look at the signs.”

That's a big message for us. Because we, like John, also want signs. We want proof. We want to know that Jesus is real and that He cares. But Jesus is telling us something important here: “You'll know Me by what I do. Not by just words, but by actions.” Sometimes we expect Jesus to show up in big, dramatic ways—like a miracle or a voice from the sky. But more often, Jesus shows Himself in quiet ways. We just must pay attention.

We might see Jesus in:

- A close friend who really listens when we are upset.
- A spouse who forgives us, even after a fight.
- A moment at Mass when the Gospel speaks directly to our heart.
- A quiet feeling of peace during prayer, even if it only lasts a minute.

A chance to help someone, and realizing it made us feel closer to God.

These are the kinds of signs Jesus was talking about. He brings healing, love, mercy, and hope. And He often does it through other people.

May Jesus use us to be a sign of His presence for others,





### Anointing of the Sick:

*“Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.”*

*-James 5:14-15*

Throughout his public ministry, Jesus healed the sick physically, mentally and spiritually. The apostles continued this ministry and handed it on to their successors. For 2,000 years, the Church has continued Jesus' ministry of healing through the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**.

At St. Angela we are going to begin celebrating each month the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick on the second weekend after Mass, alternating between the Saturday evening and the two Sunday Masses. **The next will be on Sunday, December 14th following the 10:00AM Mass.**

This Sacrament is a sacrament of healing and so is for anyone who has a chronic, serious illness, anyone preparing for surgery, or anyone suffering from the effects of advance age.

We invite all in the parish who could receive benefit and grace from this sacrament to join us on December 14th, as we pray with and for each other, asking God's healing, comfort and peace for all who receive the sacrament.

**HOLY NAME OF JESUS** Monthly Candlelight Community Peace Vigil the Last Sunday of Each Month ~ 7 PM

Our monthly candlelight vigils are held outdoors on the front steps of our church on the last Sunday of each month. In case of inclement weather, we will gather in the church vestibule. The vigil is sponsored by the Holy Name of Jesus Social Justice Group and last for 30 minutes. The purpose is to pray for unity in the community, raise awareness of social justice issues and pray for an end to violence, especially gun violence. The vigil consists of music, silent reflection, and group prayer. ALL are welcome to join us every month or whenever you're available to pray with us!


