Pondering With Deacon George:

**Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you;
he will prepare your way.**

A voice of one crying out in the desert:

**"Prepare the way of the Lord,
make straight his paths."**

In Matthew 3:1-12, John the Baptist calls people to repentance. He's not gentle about it either. He speaks with bold words to people who were very sure of their own holiness. Some of them thought they were fine just because they were part of Abraham's family. In today's language, that would be like saying, "I'm Catholic, I go to church, so I'm good." But John said that wasn't enough. God wanted their hearts to change. He wanted them to show real signs of that change. Not just talk about being good. Not just looking holy on the outside. But to actually live differently, with honesty and humility.

Our call is one of humility and to avoid "spiritual pride" but how do we do that? First, thank God when something good happens. If we helped someone, if we understood something in prayer, or if we did the right thing—don't brag. Just quietly thank God. Say, "Thank you, Lord, for helping me do that." It keeps our heart in the right place.

Second, stay curious and humble. We should avoid thinking that we know everything. There's always more to learn. Sometimes someone who doesn't go to church might still teach us something about love, kindness, or forgiveness. Be ready to listen.

Third, remember that everyone struggles. We might not see other people's weak spots, but they have them. And so do we. The next time we catch ourselves thinking we are better than someone else, pause. Ask God for help. Say a quick prayer. And remember that the most holy people are often the most humble.

Fourth, check our heart. Ask ourselves, "Why am I doing this?"

Am I doing something just to look good? Just to be praised? Or am I doing it out of love for God and others? That question can really help us stay honest.

May God help us grow in humility this Advent and avoid spiritual pride,

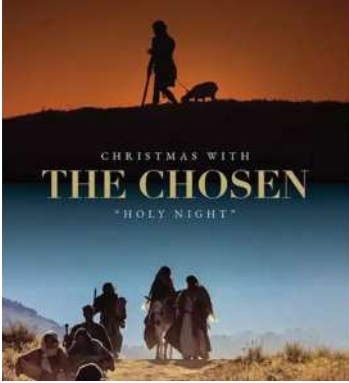

Anointing of the Sick:

"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven."

-James 5:14-15

Throughout his public ministry, Jesus healed the sick physically, mentally and spiritually. The apostles continued this ministry and handed it on to their successors. For 2,000 years, the Church has continued Jesus' ministry of healing through the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**.

At St. Angela we are going to begin celebrating each month the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick on the second weekend after Mass, alternating between the Saturday evening and the two Sunday Masses. **The next will be on Sunday, December 14th following the 10:00AM Mass.**

This Sacrament is a sacrament of healing and so is for anyone who has a chronic, serious illness, anyone preparing for surgery, or anyone suffering from the effects of advance age.

We invite all in the parish who could receive benefit and grace from this sacrament to join us on November 9th, as we pray with and for each other, asking God's healing, comfort and peace for all who receive the sacrament.

HOLY NAME OF JESUS Monthly Candlelight Community Peace Vigil the Last Sunday of Each Month ~ 7 PM
