# Rejoice that your names are written in heaven. -Luke 10: 20

The Christian song "The Truth" by Megan Woods is a song of how the world tells us we are not good enough. The world assigns our value to our work, our house, our car, how much money we have, how we look. But in the refrain of the song "The Truth", the lyrics speaks to our true value:

The truth is I am my father's child.

I make Him proud, and I make Him smile.

I was made in the image of a perfect King

### **EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION?**

The most important thing we do as Catholics is to come together as a faith community to celebrate the Eucharist; the heart and center of our Catholic life. For our celebrations to be a beautiful experience of worship for our community and worthy praise to God, we need parishioners to assist our priests and deacons in various ministries. Two liturgical ministries that play an important role at the Eucharistic Liturgy are the Ministries of Lector and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion.

As a Lector, you proclaim the Word of God with clarity to the people during the Liturgy. Recently several of our Lectors have retired, and we are looking for volunteers to replace them. Training will be provided. If you feel called to the ministry Lector or would like more information, please contact the parish office at 314-838-6565.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion serve Christ who is present in the assembly by ministering the Eucharistic Lord to their sisters and brothers in the community. They also serve the Body of Christ, the Church, by taking Communion to those members who, through sickness, old age, or other causes are prevented from taking part in the Mass. Training will be provided.

If you feel called to assist at Mass with the distribution of Holy Communion to other parishioners and/or to bring Holy Communion to those who are homebound, please contact parish office at 314-838-6565.
