#### **Fondering With Deacon George:**

#### Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division.

Although the Way of Jesus is easy and his burden light, we are reminded this weekend that the values of the Gospel and the values of the world are often opposed. We only have to look at our world and our relationships. Think about holiday dinners. People who love each other but disagree on important issues are not able to be at peace with one another, even for just one meal.

Jesus understood this struggle. He knew that following Him would not always be easy. Some people will accept His message, but others won't. In fact, He told His followers that His teachings would bring division, even within families. That might seem confusing. Isn't Jesus about love and peace? Yes, but following Him isn't always easy. Not everyone will accept His teachings. And many who think they are following Jesus are putting their faith in a Jesus of their own making and not the Jesus of the Gospels. Jesus's teachings are not watered down by the ways of the world. That's why living our faith can sometimes make us feel different or even alone.

Jesus' message challenges his followers. It asks us to change our hearts and follow God's ways. Some people accept this, but others don't. Some might feel uncomfortable because our choices remind them of what they should be doing. Others might simply not understand why faith is so important to us. Some may not be open to receive the Good News.

In our prayer, we need to pray that the Holy Spirit will give us courage to be faithful. Jesus never promised that following Him would be easy, but He did promise to be with us.

May the Holy Spirit guide us daily, Deacon George


