

# You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong? - Luke 12:20

Think about the world we live in for a moment. Everywhere we go—whether we are scrolling through social media, watching TV, or just walking past ads in a store—there's this constant message: "You need the latest thing. . . You need to look a certain way. . . . You need a certain car, etc. " to be fulfilled. It's like the world is shouting at us, "You're not enough unless you have this!" That message can feel really loud and even overwhelming sometimes.

But in today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us that there's a different way to live. He tells the story of a rich man who had everything. His fields produced so much grain that he didn't know what to do with it all. So, he decided to tear down his barns and build bigger ones to store his wealth.

He thought, "Now I can relax, eat, drink, and be merry." But God interrupts his plan and says, "You fool! This very night your life will be demanded of you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?" The man had focused so much on his possessions that he forgot what really mattered. His possessions could not save him. They could not bring him real joy.

This story might sound harsh, but Jesus is not telling it to scare us. He's telling it to wake us up. He's saying, "Don't waste your life chasing after things that don't last". Think about it—people who seem to have everything, fame and fortune, might be happy for a moment, but it does not last. They are often the unhappiest, unfulfilled people in the world. The truth is, things can't love us back. They can't give us peace. Only God can do that.

As we go about our daily lives, it is important for us to focus on the fact that God already sees us as enough. We don't have to prove our worth to Him with what we own. He made us in His image. That means we are valuable just because we are His children. Our worth is not tied to what we have. It's tied to who we are and who God created us to be.

May we always focus on that fact that life is not about the things we have. It's about the love we share, the faith we live out, and the joy that comes from being rich in God's eyes. That's the kind of treasure that lasts forever,




