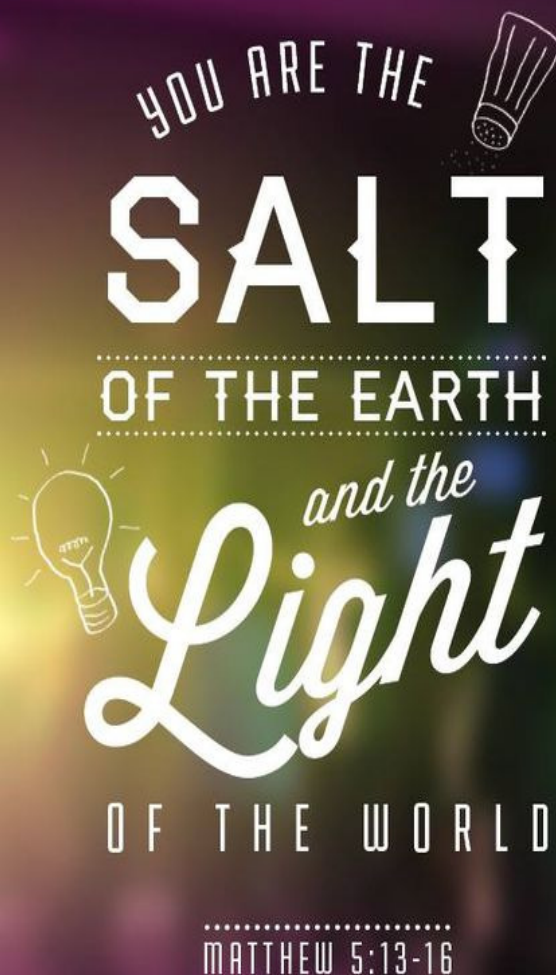

Pondering With Deacon George:

“You are the salt of the earth. . . You are the light of the world “

Our gospel this weekend is a continuation of Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount, a blueprint to living as Jesus’ disciples. In this week’s passage, Jesus uses two powerful images that calls us to reflect on our purpose as Christians and the impact our faith is meant to have on our little part of the world.

“You are the salt of the earth.” Salt was an essential and valuable commodity in Jesus’ time – used to preserve, to purify, and to enhance flavor. When Jesus calls us the “salt of the earth,” He reminds us that our lives are meant to bring out the best in others, to preserve what is good, and to prevent the decay of values and love in our communities. But salt is only effective when it is used, not when it stays hidden away. Likewise, our faith is meant to be lived actively and shared generously.

“You are the light of the world.” Light dispels darkness, offers guidance, and provides hope. By calling us “the light of the world,” Jesus entrusts us with the mission of illuminating the path for others – not by drawing attention to ourselves, but by reflecting the goodness and love of God. Just as a city on a hill cannot be hidden, our actions and choices, even the smallest acts of kindness, can shine brightly in a world that often feels shadowed by confusion, loneliness, or despair.

How do we live out our call to salt and light in the world? To be salt and light is a daily challenge. It means standing up for what is right, spreading peace, encouraging those who are struggling, and being a source of comfort and hope. Our words, attitudes, and deeds are meant to season the world with compassion and radiate Christ’s love. When we live out our faith authentically, others may see our good works and be drawn, not to us, but to glorify God.

May we give God glory this week by how we live our lives,

ANOINTING OF THE SICK DURING MASS

WEEKEND OF FEBRUARY 14-15



"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven."

- James 5:14-15

Throughout his public ministry, Jesus healed the sick both physically and spiritually. The apostles continued this ministry and handed it on to their successors. For 2,000 years, the Church has continued Jesus' ministry of healing through the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**.

At St. Angela Merici, we offer this sacrament monthly following Mass (on a rotating basis). Because of the communal nature of this Sacrament of Healing, we will also celebrate the **Anointing of the Sick**, during Mass, twice a year. The next communal celebration will be the weekend of **February 14-15 during all Masses**.

This Sacrament is a sacrament of healing and so is for anyone who has a chronic, serious illness, anyone preparing for surgery, or anyone suffering from the effects of advance age.

We invite all in the parish who could receive benefit and grace from this sacrament to join us on February 14-15 as we pray with and for each other, asking God's healing, comfort, and grace for all who receive the sacrament.
