Pondering With Deacon George:

The Cost and Beauty of Discipleship

Today's Gospel invites us to reflect on the cost and beauty of discipleship. Jesus speaks with great clarity: *"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me... and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me."* These are challenging words. They remind us that following Christ is not merely about admiration or occasional devotion; it is about placing Him at the very center of our lives. Jesus is not asking us to love our families less in a human sense, but to love Him first so that every other love can be rightly ordered. When God is first, our love becomes deeper, freer, and more faithful. But when other attachments take priority over Him, our hearts become divided.

The Lord also speaks about the cross. To follow Jesus means to accept sacrifice, inconvenience, misunderstanding, and sometimes even suffering. The cross may appear in daily responsibilities, hidden struggles, acts of forgiveness, or the courage to remain faithful in difficult circumstances. Discipleship is not always dramatic; often it is lived in quiet perseverance and trust.

Yet this Gospel is not only about loss; it is also about promise. Jesus tells us, *"Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."* The paradox of the Christian life is that when we surrender ourselves to Christ, we do not become less – we become more. In giving our lives to Him, we discover our true purpose, our deepest peace, and the joy that the world cannot give.

This message is also reflected in the call to hospitality. Even the smallest act of kindness done for Christ – welcoming a disciple, offering a cup of cold water – has value in the eyes of God. Holiness is not only found in extraordinary acts, but in simple, loving faithfulness.

Today, we are invited to ask ourselves:

What place does Christ truly hold in my life?

What cross am I being asked to carry with love and trust?

In what small ways can I welcome and serve Christ in others?

May this weekend's Liturgy remind us that discipleship costs something, but it gives everything. When we choose Christ above all, we do not lose what matters most – we find it in Him.

Anointing of the Sick:

“Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.”

Throughout his public ministry, Jesus healed the sick physically, mentally and spiritually. The apostles continued this ministry and handed it on to their successors. For 2,000 years, the Church has continued Jesus’ ministry of healing through the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.**

At St. Angela we are going to begin celebrating each month the Sacrament of

the Anointing of the Sick on the second weekend after Mass, alternating between the Saturday evening and the two Sunday Masses. **The next will be on Saturday, July 11 following the 5:00PM Mass.**

This Sacrament is a sacrament of healing and so is for anyone who has a chronic, serious illness, anyone preparing for surgery, or anyone suffering from the effects of advance age.

We invite all in the parish who could receive benefit and grace from this sacrament to join us on July 11th, as we pray with and for each other, asking God’s healing, comfort and peace for all who receive the sacrament.
