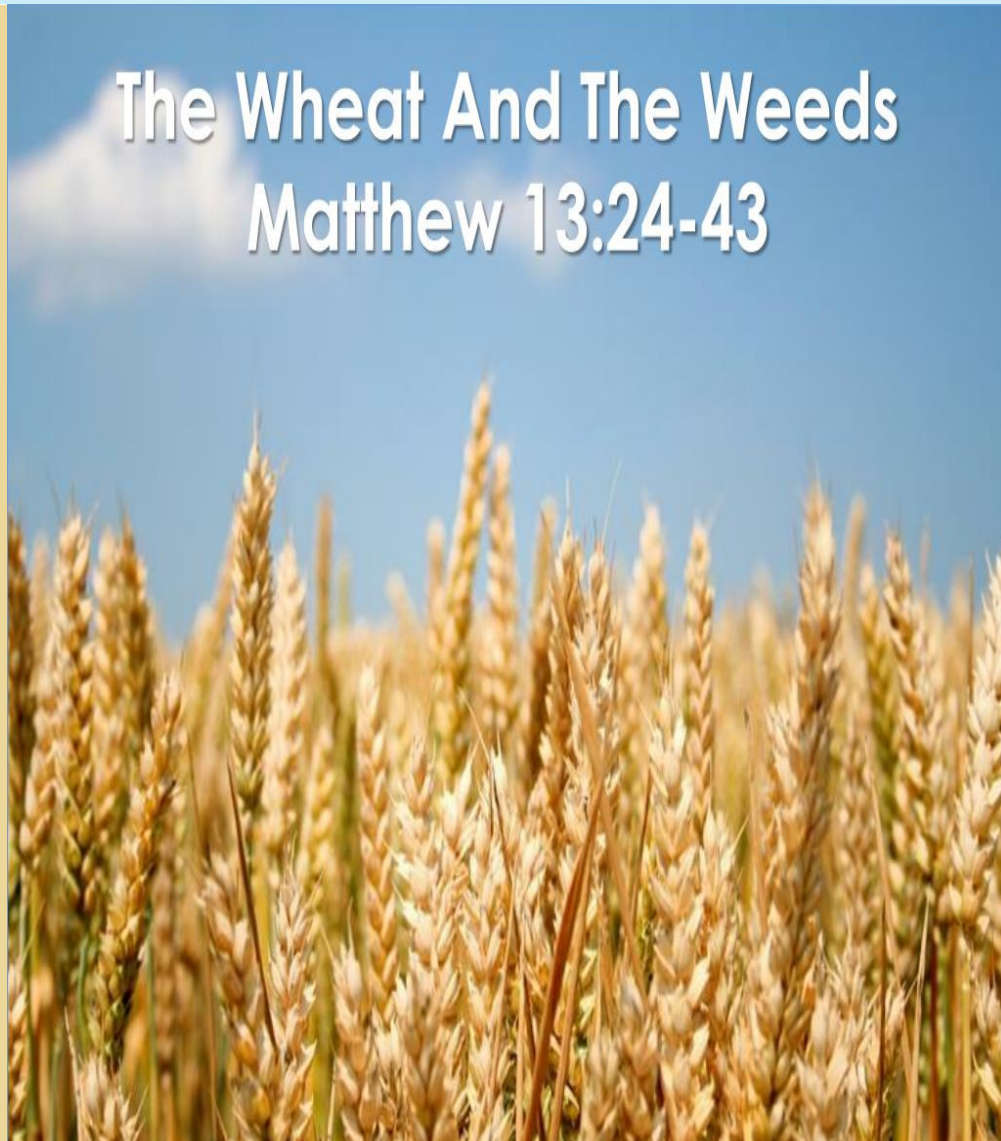

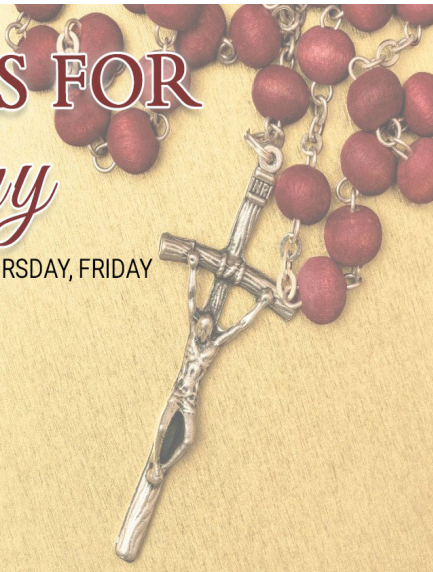

MASS INTENTIONS

If you would like to have a Mass celebrated for a loved one—deceased or living—contact Linda at the Parish Office at 314-838-6565 or stop by the office. The stipend is \$10 per Mass. There are infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefits one's soul. The special ministerial fruits of the Mass are applied to the particular intention of the Mass. We have MANY open dates and times! The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, originated in the very early Church. We have Mass Cards available in the office you can give to the family of a deceased person or Special Intention Cards for living, for a special occasion or for healing.



Pondering With Deacon George:

In our Gospels beginning last Sunday and for the next few weekends, Jesus teaches his followers in parables about the Kingdom of God and how we are to live. This weekend the readings invite us to reflect on the patience, mercy, and wisdom of God. Jesus tells the parable of the wheat and the weeds. The servants want to pull out the weeds immediately, but the owner tells them to wait until the harvest. This image reveals a God who does not rush to condemn, but gives time for conversion, growth, and repentance.

The first reading from Wisdom reminds us that God's power is shown not through harshness, but through justice joined with mercy. God is strong, yet gentle; just, yet patient. This teaches us that true strength is not found in quick judgment or punishment, but in kindness, forgiveness, and hope.

The parable is not only about good and evil in the world; it is also about the struggle within every human heart. Each of us carries both wheat and weeds: faith and doubt, love and selfishness, patience and anger. If God were to judge us too quickly, who could stand? Yet God patiently allows us time to grow, to change, and to become more like Him.

This Gospel challenges us to avoid judging others too quickly. We may see weakness, failure, or sin in another person, but we do not see the whole story. We do not know how God is working quietly in that person's life. The final judgment belongs to God, not to us. Jesus also compares the Kingdom of Heaven to a mustard seed and to yeast. Both images remind us that God often works through small and hidden beginnings. A kind word, a quiet prayer, a small act of forgiveness, or a simple decision to do what is right may seem insignificant, but in God's hands it can grow into something life-giving and powerful.

This Sunday invites us to be patient with ourselves, patient with others, and patient with God's timing. Instead of trying to uproot every weakness by force, we are called to nourish what is good: prayer, charity, humility, forgiveness, and trust. The more we allow God's grace to grow in us, the less room there will be for the weeds of sin.

May we allow God's Kingdom take root in our lives and bear fruit for God's glory,

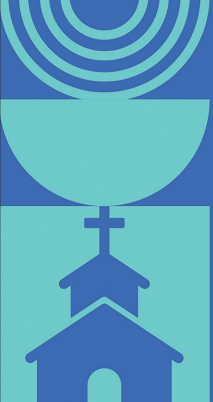
