Pondering With Deacon George:

Pondering with Deacon George

In our scriptures this weekend, the Word of God speaks to the deepest hunger of the human heart. In the first reading, God calls out through the prophet Isaiah: "All you who are thirsty, come to the water!" This invitation is not only for those who have enough money, strength, or success. It is for everyone. God offers life freely, generously, and without condition.

The Gospel shows this same generous love in action. Jesus has just heard of the death of John the Baptist and withdraws to a deserted place. Yet when the crowds follow him, he does not send them away. His heart is moved with compassion. He heals the sick, stays with the people, and feeds them when they are hungry. Even in his own grief, Jesus makes room for the needs of others.

The disciples see only the problem: the place is deserted, the hour is late, and the food is too little. But Jesus sees possibility. He tells them, "Give them some food yourselves." Their five loaves and two fish seem almost nothing before such a large crowd, but when placed in the hands of Jesus, little becomes more than enough. Everyone eats, everyone is satisfied, and twelve baskets are left over.

This miracle reminds us that God does not ask us to solve every problem by ourselves. He asks us to bring what we have: our faith, time, kindness, gifts, prayers, and even our weaknesses. In the hands of Christ, our small offering can become a blessing for many. The question is not whether we have enough; the question is whether we are willing to give what we have to Jesus.

This Sunday, the Lord invites us to come hungry and thirsty, not only for food, but for mercy, hope, healing, and peace. He also invites us to notice the hunger of others. Around us there are people who hunger for encouragement, forgiveness, companionship, justice, and love. Like the disciples, we may feel that what we have is not enough. But Jesus says, "Bring them here to me."

When we place our lives in the hands of Jesus, he blesses, breaks, and shares them for the good of others. The Eucharist is the greatest sign of this truth: Christ gives himself as food for the life of the world. Fed by him, we are called to become people of compassion, generosity, and trust,

Anointing of the Sick:

“Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.”

-James 5:14-15

Throughout his public ministry, Jesus healed the sick physically, mentally and spiritually. The apostles continued this ministry and handed it on to their successors. For 2,000 years, the Church has continued Jesus’ ministry of healing through the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**.

All the Sacraments have a communal nature to them; and because of this, twice a year we celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during Mass at St. Angela Merici (August and February). **Next weekend, August 8 -9, we will celebrate the Anointing of the Sick during both the 5:00 PM Saturday evening Mass and Sunday, 10:00 AM Mass.**

This Sacrament is a sacrament of healing and so is for anyone who has a chronic, serious illness, anyone preparing for surgery, or anyone suffering from the effects of advance age.

We invite all in the parish who could receive benefit and grace from this sacrament to join us on August 8th or 9th, as we pray with and for each other, asking God’s healing, comfort and peace for all who receive the sacrament.

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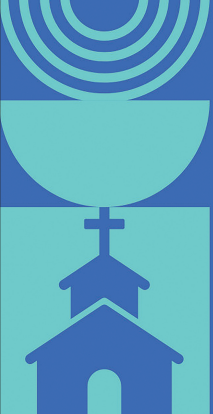
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
